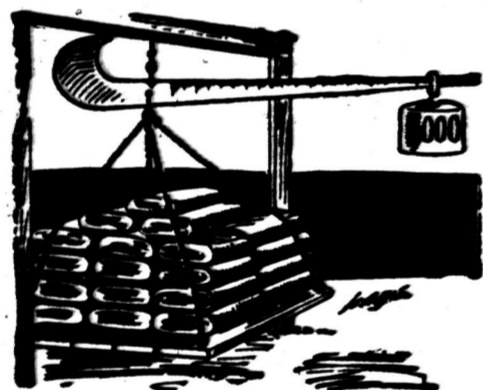

O. A. C. Renews its Offer of Assistance in Drainage.

In July 1909 the Department of Physics at the O. A. C. prepared a plan of drains for a 52-acre block of land that had never grown a crop, it was too wet. The drains were laid that autumn. In 1910 that 52 acres yielded potatoes and corn to the value of \$2250. The farm lies within five miles of the city of London. Why had this land lain useless for generation? Perhaps the previous owners thought it could not be drained—as a matter of fact it was a difficult problem, for this land was very flat and the outlet poor. Perhaps they did not believe drainage would pay—this one crop should convince. Or perhaps they believed in drainage but did not know just how to undertake such extensive drainage operations.

The Ontario Agricultural College is endeavoring to help those in doubt about drainage. Any farmer in Ontario wishing assistance in his drainage problems may have the same by making application to the Department of Physics, O. A. C., Guelph. As soon as possible after receipt of the application a drainage adviser is sent to make a survey of the land, after which he makes a complete map showing the location of the drains, the grade, size of the tile, etc. When completed the map is sent to the owner, so that he has an accurate guide to follow in putting in his drains. As in previous years, the only outlay to the farmer is the necessary travelling expenses of one man in connection with the survey. The railways gives a rate of a cent a mile for this work, so that the travelling expenses are light.

After one survey in each locality a Drainage Demonstration is held right in the field surveyed, to which all the neighbors are invited. At this meeting simple methods are demonstrated of making a drainage survey, finding the fall of a ditch, determining the grade, digging, to grade, etc.

Those wishing to make application for a survey should write the Department of Physics, O. A. C., Guelph, whereupon regular application forms will be sent.

Book-keeping on the Farm

Every farmer could evolve a system of book keeping suited to his own conditions without much trouble. Still there is a need for some simple form of keeping track of the operations on a farm that will take as little of the farmer's time as possible, and at the time, of just how his business stands. Boys and girls have graduated from the rural public school into the high school and have got all the high school could teach them without learning anything about farm, book-keeping. Book keeping has been taught, it is true but it has been the kind adapted to conducting a business in the city. Like the arithmetics in use in the schools, examples in the book-keeping line have been drawn up with the idea that every pupil was being fitted for some calling than that on the farm. It should not be difficult for the educational department to evolve a system of book keeping suitable to the farm and to pass this on to the teachers in the public schools for use in teaching the older boys and girls from the farm how to keep an accurate account of the operations of their father's farms. It would be as good home training as a boy or girl could have to jot down in their proper places the various transactions on the farm during the day.
