

To Sharpen A Lawn Mower

Take the driving wheels of, re ratchets and change them, placing the left ratchet on the right and the right ratchet on the left side of the machine. This will cause the revolving blades to strike backward on the cutting bar. Put some heavy machine oil in the groove on the cutti Turn the mower upside down and push it around, keeping the cutting bar in close contact with the revolving blades. As Mr. and Mrs. Geo.
