

Road No. 1-The Talbot Road, from he West boundary, County of Haldimand to the village of Canboro, passing through Jarvis and Cayuga. No. 2-Hamilton and Port Dover Plank Road, from where it enters the County of

Haldimand on boundary line, between the townships of Walpole and Woodhouse, northward, to northern boundfry of the County of Haldimand, passing through Jarvis, Ragersville and Caledonia. No. 3- Fownship of Walpole from the
