Village Council

Jarvis, June 14, 1911

The adjourned meeting of the Court of Revision met, the Reeve in the chair.

Burwash—Homes—that this year's assessment roll for 1911, with the following changes, namely that James Hodges be struck off (he having sold out to Wm. E. Armstrong); that Raymond Morrow be struck off; that Wm. E. Armstrong be added as owner of lot No. 6, south of Talbot street; that Berkeley Armstrong be added as M.F.; that one dog be struck off for Homer Smithson.—Carried.

Allen—Homes—that the Court of Revision be now closed and that the Council resume general business.—Carried.

A letter was read from Mrs. Stadder, regarding defective sidewalk, which was discussed and laid over till next meeting.

The Standard Paving Company made an offer to build the required amount of sidewalk at one cent advance on the price paid in 1910.

Burwash—Allen—that this Council do not accept the offer of the Standard Paving Co.—Carried.

Allen—Lewie—that this Council expend the sum of \$675 on cement sidewalks and crossings this summer and that the contract therefor be given to Jos. Barber and that he do the work on the same terms as to contract as the Standard Paving Co. in 1910 and that the price per foot (face measure) be 13 1/2 cents for walks and 16 1/2 cents for crossings, and that the Reeve be requested to notify Jos. Barber of the acceptance of his offer.—Carried.

Holmes—Burwash—that the Clerk be requested to notify the Clerk of the Township of Walpole that the Council is willing to pay one half of the township's share for maintaining the gate at the G.T.R. station crossing.—Carried.

Allen—Burwash—that the Council adjourn to meet again at call of the Reeve. Carried.
