Fatal Accident

A sad fatality occurred in the township of Oneida, near Clanbrassil, P. E. Webster, the well-known merchant of Clanbrassil, being the victim and death took place while he was driving to his home from Hagersville. Mr. Webster had been in Hamilton during the day, taking the train at Hagersville and he was returning home at night, driving from the latter place when the accident occurred. About ten o'clock his body was found by members of the family, its position being between the wheels and box of the vehicle. (Corner Dr. McDonald of Hagersville was notified but after viewing the remains it was concluded that death was due probably as the result of an accident. It is thought Mr. Webster may have been thrown out by a jolt of the vehicle into a rut in the road. The horses continued on their way home and the body was not found till the horses reached there. The late P. E. Webster is a son of Mr. B. H. Webster, postmaster of Hagersville, and was born near Dunnville fifty-two years ago. For the past eleven years he has resided at Clanbrassil, where he conducted a general store, and was well known throughout the county, as he did quite an extensive business in the buying of farm produce. A widow and two children, Harry and Gladys survive, and to them and his father much sympathy will be extended by their many acquaintances throughout the County. One brother Mr. Orrin Webster, resides in the West. This makes the second fatal accident occurring in that neighborhood during the past few weeks—the former being a young man named Dennis from Welland, who was thrown from a wagon load of lumber and had his neck broken.
