ELECTRIC STERILIZING. An apparatus that sterilizes milk by electric light has been invented in Holland. It contains a thin stream of milk may be made to flow over the surface of it. EGGS AND HOW TO PREPARE THEM. The best eggs for preserving are those less than twenty-four hours old. As it is many times impossible to get strictly fresh eggs necessary to use some test. "Candling" is a common test. To candle eggs hold them up against a light; the fresh eggs appear clouded. If incubation has begun a dark spot is seen; a rotten egg appears dark colored.

Salt and Lime Water Recipe No. 1. Use one cup of slack lime, one cup salt, one gallon water. Get ordinary unslaked lime and pour water on it until when slaked it is of the consistency of thick clabber.

Salt and Lime Water Recipe No. 2. One bushel lime; water enough to float eggs; two and one-half pounds common salt; one-half pound cream of tartar.

Salt and Lime Water Recipe No. 3. One-half pound salt; chunk of lime size of an egg; one gallon boiling water.
