Canada's total trade for the past fiscal year amounted to \$862,699,732, an increase of no less than \$108,695,343, as compared with the preceding fiscal year. Imports totalled \$547,882,000, an increase of nearly \$86,000,000; exports totalled \$315,317,250, an increase of nearly \$18,000,000. The year's increase in trade over fourteen per cent, is one of the largest if not the largest in the history of Canada. According to present indications, the Dominion's trade for the current fiscal year will run very close to the billion dollar mark. Of the total imports for the past year \$325,204,452 were dutiable goods, while \$186,144,219 were free goods. The Customs revenue totalled \$87,549,542, an increase of \$14,250,908. Exports of domestic products for the year totalled \$290,233,857, the principal items being, Agricultural products, \$107,143,375; animals and their produce, \$48,210,654; mines, \$41,324,516; forest, \$40,892,674; manufactures, \$35,536,674; fisheries, \$16,704,679. The increase in agricultural exports was approximately \$24,500,000. There were decreases of a little over four million in the exports of animals and their produce, nearly five millions in the exports of animals in the exports of the forest, and a million and a half in mineral exports. During the year Canada imported cotton and bullion to the value of \$26,033,831 as compared with only \$10,206,210 for the preceding year.

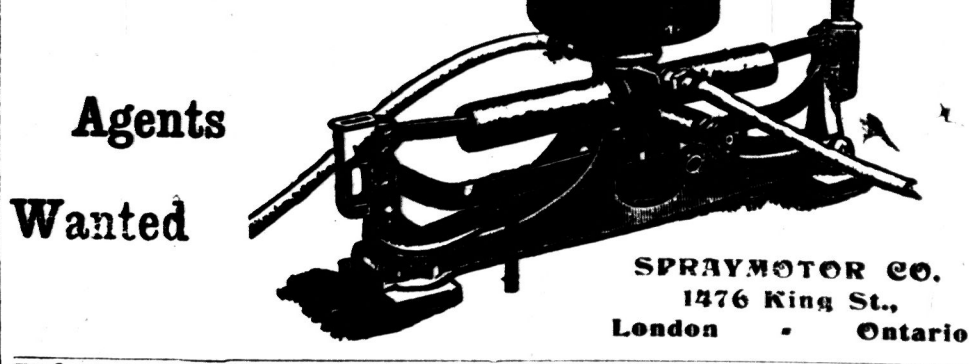

Mr. J. S. Wootton, daughter of the late Nathan Pezz, of Simcoe passed away at her home in Milford, Mich., on Monday, June 3. She had suffered a stroke of paralysis and died a few hours afterward. Mrs. Wootton was well known in Simcoe and vicinity.

When you get a splinter in your fingers it is sometimes possible to get it by pressing the point of a needle under it, but unless you have deft fingers or a pair of tweezers you may not be able to pull it out even then. A new pen nib is a good substitute for tweezers. Lay the nib over the splinter so as to hide it. Then press down hard enough to separate the nibs. If you now let the pen nib level with the splinter and allow the nibs to close again they will take hold, and you can draw the splinter out. Remember that any metal thing that is to be applied to a wound such as a needle, penknife or pen, should be passed lightly through a flame first, so as to disinfect it. A gas jet or a match will do.

Grapes on the Farm.
Every farmer in the grape growing sections may have a profitable bit of ground to grapes—a small vineyard. Not only the local but the shipping demand is growing and prices are remunerative. Besides, grapes are a very useful fruit in the family. No fruit is more healthy and it may be put up in many easy and cheap ways. Grape vines require very little attention. They must be staked in a way to keep them off the ground, and in the very early spring they should be set back and pruned closely. That is about all there is to it. The grapes are born on an entirely new growth and close pruning increases their growth and admits the needed sunshine.
