The Story Of The Postage Stamp

England was the first country to use postage stamps. In 1840 the Insular fares every Tuesday till April 30th, comon letters. Three years later Switzerland and what was then the Empire of Brazil followed suit. In Germany stamps were adopted about 1844. Comparatively few kinds of stamps have been issued in Germany. Spain has issued 424 and Portugal as many as 846 different stamps. France and her colonies have so far issued 1,222 different postage stamps. England on account of its many colonies, takes the lead in the matter of variety, having brought out nearly two thousand different stamps.
