Around About Us.

L. W. Pierce and son have sold their livery business in Tillsonburg to Stenelk Barrett.

The Port Rowan Cheese and Butter Factory has been incorporated with a capital of \$10,000.

The Presbyterians of Tillsonburg are against church union. The vote was 86 for and 92 against.

Lebus Cellvm, a former reeve of Townsland, and a prominent man of Norfolk, has purchased the property of G. Sterling in Colborne.

Mrs. Elizabeth Thompson Bushell, relict of the late James Bushell, passed away at the home in Dunnville on Tuesday, March 12th, in her 87th year.

Jack Brown, who has for the past couple of years been a member of the staff of the Bank of Hamilton at Delhi, has been transferred to Milverton. Prior to leaving he was waited on and presented with a club bag from his friends.

The death occurred on Friday of Mrs. Marie Swetman, an old and highly respected resident of Tillsonburg, at the age of 75 years. Deceased was a native of England. She leaves a daughter, Mrs. James Burvill, and two sons, John and Albert, to mourn her loss.

At the Dunnville Baptist church Wednesday morning, March 13th, the pastor Rev. C. S. G. Boone, performed the ceremony uniting in marriage Miss Caroline Jones, youngest daughter of Mrs. Henrietta Kewley, to Elmo Booker, eldest son of Thos. Booker of Rainham.

The death occurred on Wednesday of Mrs. James Tune, a resident of London for the past thirty years. Mrs. Tune was born in Simcoe seventy years ago and for many years, her husband being the head of a firm manufacturing aerated waters. The business was later removed to London.

After an illness of a year and a half Alexander McFarlane died at the home of his nephew, Hamilton, Saturday afternoon, aged 69 years. Deceased was born in Picton, Nova Scotia, but had lived in Tillsonburg the greater part of his life, from which place he went to Hamilton in 1901.

Alfred Brooks, son of Wm. Brooks, Seneca, was seriously hurt while engaged with a circular saw at Mrs. Elijah Spencer's, Seneca, on Tuesday morning. In some manner he got caught in the shaft and before the machinery could be stopped he was considerably bruised and cut, but it is thought no bones were broken.

Another former resident of Simcoe in the person of Albert Adams of Oshawa was called by death on Sunday, March 10. Mr. Adams, who was in his 54th year, was taken ill with appendicitis, and had an operation performed on Wednesday of last week, but the terminated fatally. Deceased was formerly engaged in the marble business in that town.

A company has been formed to establish a canning factory in Victoria. The ground has been bought for the factory, and contracts signed by the farmers for the growings of 100 acres of tomatoes. Victoria is only eight miles from Simcoe, the head quarters of the Canadian Cannery, and has no qualities of soil or advantage of soil or advantage of climate which that community does not possess.

March 13 was the thirty-ninth anniversary of Mr. and Mrs. Sutton's wedding day, and was also Mr. Sutton's sixty-first birthday. The Up-and-Down Club and their husbands seized the opportunity of holding a surprise party in honor of Mr. and Mrs. Sutton and invaded their home last evening, when a charming social time was enjoyed. During the evening Mr. Sutton was presented with a Flemish oak card table.—Simcoe Reformer.

While working in the saw mill at the Steel works, Tillsonburg, Saturday, Samuel Apden met with a serious accident. He was operating the saw when by some means his right hand got caught in the machinery, resulting in the loss of the last three fingers and part of the hand. He was taken to the Emergency hospital where the wound was attended to, some skin being grafted on in order to save as much of the hand as possible.

The home of Mr. and Mrs. L. Hicks, Tillsonburg, was the scene of a very pretty event on Wednesday 13th inst., at 1.30 o'clock, when their only daughter, Eva May, was united in the holy bonds of matrimony to E. E. Teffy of Otterville. The bride who was given away by her father, and was unattended, was becomingly attired in a gown of white marquisette trimmed with fringe and satin lace, and carried a shower bouquet of white carnations. The ceremony was performed by Rev. C. N. Dewey.
