An Example in Dealing With Auto Fiends

While our neighbors in the United States have not always set us a satisfactory example in the manner in which they deal with people guilty of deliberate murder, they have more than once shown how to handle offenders of other classes.

A case in point occurred the other day when a man who had, while under the influence of liquor, run down and killed a boy with his motor, was sentenced to not less than five nor more than ten years in New Jersey State prison. What makes this case all the more noteworthy is that the offender is a member of a prominent family, the son of a city judge, and a nephew of a man who for some years was judge of Court of Common Pleas. If a similar offence had been committed in Ontario, by one in a corresponding position, recent experiences justify the belief that the offender would have been sentenced with a reprimand, or at most with a term in prison such as an ordinary drunk would be condemned to ten years.
