### Note and Comment

Wm. K. Vanderbilt, jun., has been sued for a grocer's bill of \$642. Perhaps he was merely trying out that grocer.

The number of deaths from tuberculosis in Toronto in April was forty-three as against thirty-seven for the same month last year. Perhaps, however, it may only be a case of the record better kept.

A German scientist says the average man or woman's body contains phosphorus enough to be worth 2,200 matches—taking fat, phosphorus and magnesium to produce 7.50 of material, it will manage.

Six thousand agriculturists and artisans from Scotland embarked for Canada last week. They are said to have been the pick of their classes, and the Unionists are making great complaints of parting with such men.

It is 27 years ago Wednesday since Louis Reil, the French half-breed leader in the Northwest rebellions, was captured in Winnipeg, and shortly afterwards executed for treason. What a great change has taken place in Canada since those days!

Richeson, the murderer of Avis Linnell, is to be electrocuted, although alienists have found him to be a somnambulist, neurotic, a neurasthenic and subject to hysterical insanity. Apparently it does not require a great deal of mental strength to go to the chair in Massachusetts.

A charge against two sons for failing to support their mother has been laid in the Toronto Police Court under a statute passed in the reign of Queen Elizabeth. The injunction is of even more ancient date and is to be found in the twentieth chapter of the Book of Exodus.

A woman died in her 105th year, in East Orange, N. J., on Thursday last being able to read and sew well without glasses. A little later her sight and hearing failed her and she passed away. She crossed the ocean seven times, but not all a day before she was 102 years old.

Evelyn Thaw is said to be dishonored by obstacles to her divorce from Harry and is striving to collect \$15,000, the amount of three cheques given to her by Harry Thaw's mother, the payment of which has been stopped. The story put in circulation that Evelyn Thaw is the mother of a twenty-one months old baby is absolutely untrue.

A New York wife shammed suicide, and says her object was to discover whether her husband's love was as strong as when they were married seventeen years ago. The husband married a widow with three children three weeks later. The wife then demanded that he return to her, and the second one gave him up without protest.

Take the matter of the schoolroom walls, for example. To the ordinary, unspecialized parent, this doubtless appears a subject of no consequence. Oh, the crass and cruel ignorance of the modern parent! The color of the walls is one of the most potent influences in moulding the character of the child—at least so the expert employed by the Chicago Board of Education says. The colors that are on the walls of schools," she says, "have no place on the educational plans of civilization. Pinks, light green and reds are seen, and they demoralize the children and prevent successful discipline. Dark blue and dark green tend to soothe them. The other excite and irritate them."

But in matter what a man may think, the time is coming when he will be forced to leave this present sphere, and every man ought to consider seriously what this leaving will mean for those whom he leaves behind. Whether he has a right to impose perpetual widowhood upon one whom he has made his companion, is one of the things open to grave doubt. Marriage often means more to a woman than it does to a man, for reasons so obvious that they do not need to be discussed. To impose a perpetual widowhood upon a young woman is almost to commit a crime.

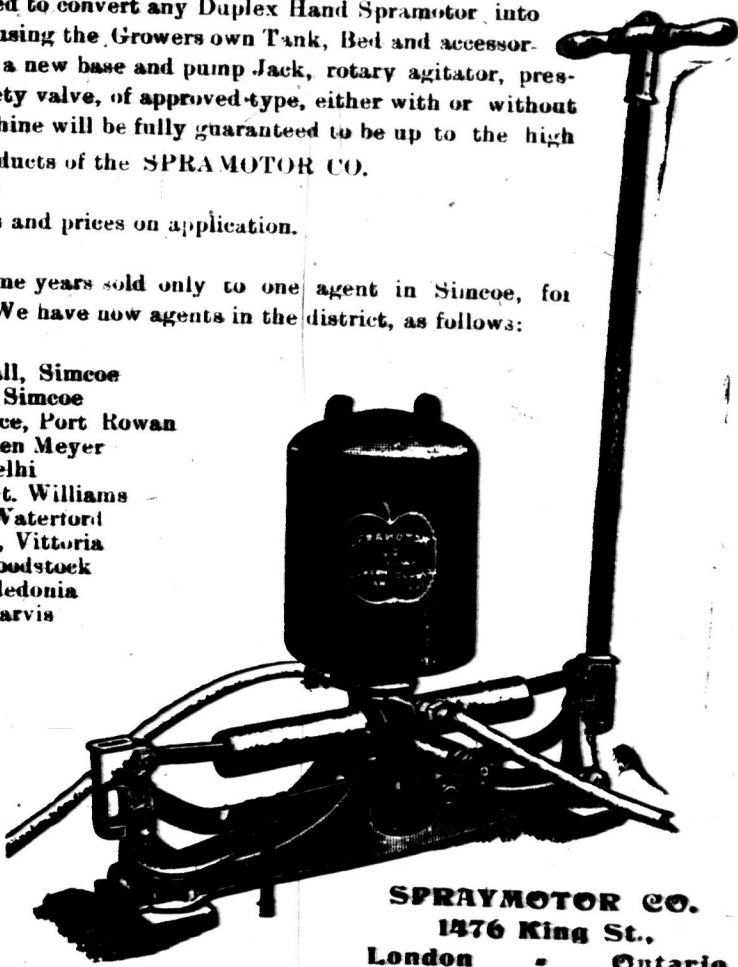

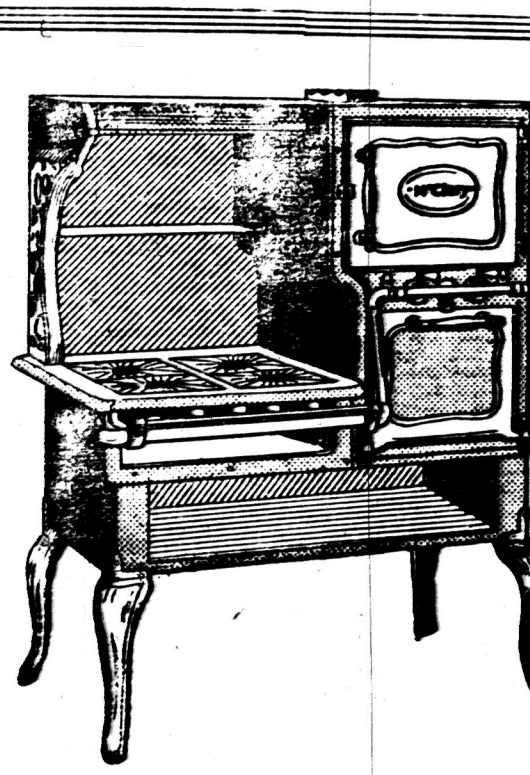
