To Avoid Accidents.

Drivers of automobiles are usually very careful to prevent accidents resulting from frightening and running away of horses. There may be some who do not care a rap about it, but they are exceptions. However, accidents sometimes occur in this way when the drivers are not altogether to blame, and might be avoided if a little thoughtfulness were exercised by the other fellows. If on approaching a car it is desired to have it slow up, the person behind the horse should hold up the hand as signal. This will be understood and attention will be paid to it. The law says this should be done, and failure to do so relieves the drivers of automobiles of all responsibility should an accident occur.

Potato Growers Warned

A note of warning has been sounded from Ottawa in regard to a very dangerous potato disease that has been brought to Canada in tubers imported from Europe during the present year. The disease which is known as Potato Canker was recently discovered in an imported shipment. To warn Canadian farmers against the danger of planting imported seed, the Director of the Experimental Farms has issued a leaflet known as "Farmers' Circular No. 1" prepared by Mr. H. T. Gussow, the Dominion Botanist which contains the following points: 1. The only way in which the disease can be introduced is through the planting of affected tubers. 2. The use of diseased tubers for seed may, in the worst cases, result in the complete destruction of the entire crop. 3. When once introduced the disease germ infests the soil for a period of eight years, which means that for at least eight years no sound potatoes can be raised on land thus infested. 4. None of the known remedies for other plant diseases will prevent the appearance of the disease. 5. The disease is spread readily through infested soil carried by wind, animals, farm implements, old bags or other means. Attention is called to provision under the destructive insect and Pest Act which show that to use or sell for seed potatoes imported from Europe is illegal. Around About Us.

Thursday May 16th, Rev. W. W. Conrad, was inducted to the pastorate of the Delhi and Windham Centre Presbyterian churches.

Miss Jennie Kyle, a former well known resident of Tillsonburg was married to Mr. Austin, a building contractor of Los Angeles, Cal. The marriage took place at the home of Chas. Proctor. Miss Kyle left Tillsonburg to reside in Los Angeles about a year ago.

Chat Lang's horse ran away Friday night at Waterford. Chat was dumped out and the buggy ran over him, injuring him so severely that it was necessary to send for a doctor. Saturday morning he received word that his brother, Joseph Lange, of Rockford, was seriously ill, and although he was suffering severe pain he made the trip to Rockford.

Daniel J. Barry passed away at Mounds Park Sanitarium, St. Paul, Minn., on Friday May 17th, in his 32nd year. Deceased was a son of the late David Barry of Canboro. His mother died in 1894, and his father in 1898. He took up telegraphy in Dunnville at Harrison's drug store. When he came east to Dunnville Christmas he contracted a heavy cold, which finally developed into typhoid fever. His remains were taken to Dunnville for burial.

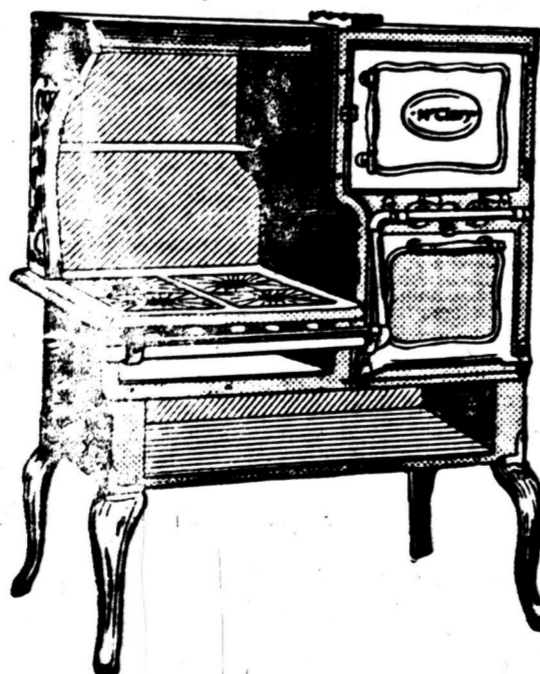

Reading in Bed

To those addicted to the practice of reading in bed the remarks of Dr. Carl Seller will be of interest. He states that there is no valid reason to be urged against using the eyes in a proper manner in a recumbent position—such use is the least tiresome and can be persisted in for longer periods without damage than any other position. Three easily avoided errors cause all the harm possible from reading lying down, the first often leading to the other two. They are insufficient or wrongly directed light, short reading distance, and tipping the book out of a plane at right angles to the line of vision. If, however, everyone reading lying down will so arrange his bed or lounge so that the light comes over the head without striking the eye, and falls well upon the page; if he will hold his book at a long reading distance and take care that the line of letters shall be at right angles to the line of vision he can be sure of doing his eyes no more harm than if he were sitting up. More than this, there is much positively in favor of reading lying down. Dr. Seller concludes: "The recumbent posture allows more rest of the bodily structures than the sitting posture, and there is greater possibility of resting and repair in that position."

A good many years ago, when a boy was whipped in school, he received another whipping when he went home, but in these days the father and mother wipe his tears away and go and whip the teacher.

Any one who loses \$40 or more at one sitting, playing cards, or at dice tables, or any other game and who pays over the money lost, may without in three months, sue and recover the money lost. This is a recent amendment of the Gambling Act, and is called another blow to gambling. The moral is that when one wins \$39.99 he should cash in and take a stroll in search of another game.
