Geneda Must Improve Her Uniformity in Canadian Live Stock Production

What is to be done in order to build up the meat maustry of Canada? There will be little use for abattors if the farmers do not raise animals for shoughter therein, T and the question is now not so much how a can we export our surplus meat, but rath er how can we import enough meat to feed ourselves.

Canada, like other growing countries, is already facing a shortage in meat supply. The population is rapidly increasing, whereas the supply of cattle, sheep and nogs is less than hve years ago. The breaking up of the ranch and range country in the west into small farm; has made serious inroads into the supply of beef and mutton from that territory, and has practically cut off the supply of thin young attle which formerly were shipped to Ontario to be finished over.

Grain farmers of the western provinces are being urged by experimental farm two days during which time many matters and farm papers to diversify their farming discussed. Some of these were the not only for safety as to returns, but as an insurance against the time when fertility will be so depleated that yields of grain will be no longer profitable.

Live stock is a safeguard not only for the farmer, but would be a big factor in helping solve the car shortage problem which is so acute every fall. Grain farmers all want to market their grain at the same time and get the money. Sheep and steers can be marketed every day in the year, provide a safe revenue, and distribute the traffic for the transportation companies. There is at present a market in Canada for all live stock produce and for all kinds of smoked meats, lard, ham and bacon, so that the market is here with good prices. As the population increases this market will grow.

One of the greatest drawbacks against more live stock in the west is the fact that anadian banks are not allowed to accept ive stock as collateral for loans, whereas fitable cattle loan business is done by large cattle loaning companies who get behind the qeginner in the live stock business from his investment.

Distate for jury duty is natural. In rder to serve, you must neglect your rdinary occupations, submit to a restricion of your personal liberty, and perhape thrown in association with extremel. incongenial persons. Nevertheless, noth ing is more executial to the just execution of the laws than competent, intelligent air-minded jurors. Inasmuch as men who answer to the description are usually occupied with important affairs of their own, it follows that those whose service is most desirable are precisely those to whom the duty is most onerous, and consequently those who endeavor most earnestly to avoid it. No remedy has been discovered. It is impossible to make jury duty attractive to a busy man; it is equally impossible to prevent it from interfering with the juror's personal business. Nothing except devotion to the welfare of the community will ever lead men to lay aside their aversion to serve. The unwillingness of competent men to perform this duty is not the only and perhaps not the greatest, difficulty In order to be accepted as a juror in a eriminal case, a man must not hold any previously conceived opinion as to the guilt of the person to he tried; yet the newspapers print the most minute details of crimes, and publish all they can learn that bears in any way on the guilt or innocence of the accused. Since almost every one reads the newspapers, it is the added difficulty of finding men who have no scruples about capital punishment.
