



UNIFORMITY IN CANADIAN DAIRY

A few month sago there was held at Ottawa a conference of dairy experts and officials from all parts of the Dominion. The meeting was called by the Minister of Agriculture for the purpose of endeavoring to perpetuate the uniformity of the quality and character of Canadian cheese and butter that has been responsible for the success of Canadian dairying. As pointed out by the Dairy and Cold Storage Commissioner, who presided over the Conference, many things come up in the practice of dairying over which slight differences of opinion may arise, so that it seems desirable to bring together from time to time those in charge of dairy schools, and the chief instructors, in the various Provinces, to discuss methods and various Provinces, to discuss methods and practices, in order to arrive at some agreement as a body of dairy advisors. The Conference lasted two days, during which time many matters of importance were taken up and freely discussed. Som of these were the pasteurization of whey. factory refuse in relation to tuberculosis in hogs, testing and grading cream at cream gathering ceameries, whey butter, methods of paying patrons of cheese factories, and other subjects relating to the production of butter and cheese. For the information of buttermakers and cheesemakers, and others interested in dairying there has been pairwise. dairying, there has been printed a verbatim report of the proceedings of this Conference. 
