Treasurer's Sale of Lands for Arrears of Taxes

County Treasurer's Sale of Lands for arrears of taxes, Co. of Haldimand, to wit:

Some people laugh with a little effort as some people worry.

Ruthie accompanied her mamma to prayer service, and during the service the hymn "Cross and Crown" the first line of which reads, "The consecrated cross I'll bear," etc., was sung with much fervor by the congregation, when Ruthie considerably upset her mother's gravity by whispering excitedly: "Mamma, what does a cross-eyed bear look like?"

Carefully prepared statistics according to a leading medical journal, show that woman tested by length of life, are physically superior to men in power to endure suffering and resist disease. Figures taken from the United States census returns show that "for every 25-year period from birth up to 70 years of age, the death rate is much greater among males than among females." From 70 to 80 the death rate is about equal. But from 80 to 90, "There are about five women living to four men." From 90 to 100 there are two women to one man. And after 100 the proportion is even greater. The interesting conclusion is reached that, after making due allowances for the mortality of men in war, from accidents in dangerous occupations and from masculine excesses, "There are good reasons for believing that nothing short of constitutional difference can account for the greater tenacity of life in women."
