The New Store

Opens For Business

Kany Conveniences Characterise It-Commodious Quarters for Every Department

What the Simcoe Reformer thinks of he new Falls store. The article below preared in their paper last week:

After more than a score of years. goods were sold and change made for the last time by the Falls Company in the old store last Fridty. Simultaneously with the falling of the curtain there, business began in the colossal new store across the way, and now the tide of commerce is flowing free and strong, with the promise of vigorously and energetically expanding as time goes on.

From the time that the Falls Company

started business in the old place, increase in trade has been steady, and for the last few years especially, growing pains were felt, and the management has known that more space must be added, so crowded did the old store become. Therefore, Mr. Falls obtained the site on the corner of Norfolk and Argyle streets, and then com-menced to plan. Slowly but steadily the plans grew, until the present large store was conceived, with its spacious aisles and vast shelf surfaces: It was the intention to have plenty of room, with the smallest possible proportion of waste corners. The building, too, was to have little superflu-ous adornment, but was to be safe and solid, and with all possible convenience for shoppers and employees. All the working out of these details took time, but the result is pleasing to all concerned.

The progress of the building was watched with interest, and when the great store was finally opened last week, customers and sightseers flocked in throngs to visit the interior. Although the four floors are so capacious and extensive, yet the large stock is arranged so cleverly that the dimentions are not oppressive, and a sense of cosiness and comfort is a feature. The beautiful woodwork, the panelled ceilings, the elevator, the many conveniences, all have met with the approval of the visitors. ond disorder after the very rapid moving from one premises to the other, but to their surprise everything ran smoothly, all details having been so thoroughly planned that business went on without a break.

A watchman is on duty at night, beginning his work at 10 and going off at 8 next morning. He sweeps the floors every night, and places and removes the coverings of the tables and counters, thus relieving the clerks of what used to be a burdensome part of their work. All the saleswomen are attired uniformly in black, a distinctive feature that has been adopted in all large city stores. Perhaps the most striking characteristic of the shop is the large extent of the window display. The large plateglass windows extend on Norfolk street turned from the Hamilton hospital on the full 80 feet of the store, and on Argyle street for 50 feet. Here the skilled window dressers have ample scope for their art. By night these windows are beautifully lighted by electricity. Indeed, throughout the whole establishment the lighting has been made an important item. Many windows introduce floods of light to show off the goods by day, and at night gas and electricity are requisitioned so that the purchasers may see what they are getting. A small gas engine supplies the power for the electricity. Another point that meets with the approbation of all who frequents the Falls store is the rest and waiting room on the second floor.
