#### Ocean Liners as Firetraps

A calamity at sea even greater than that of the Titanic is predicted by Capt. R. F. Hobson. The danger that he sees is that of fire, the most appalling of all ocean perils in its possibilities of panic and to bring death. Sacrificing safety to luxury, the great steamships are crowded and fitted with sumptuously carved furniture and trim. Capt. Hobson points a moral from the Spanish war. Cervera's ships burned like torches under the American gunfire because of the great amount of woodwork they carry. Everything wooden is now virtually obsolete on warships, but passenger vessels remain fire-traps. Most of the costly splendors now brought in could be bricked in metal furniture and trim, and the rest could be dispensed with.

#### Mustard Weed to Disappear

By the successful experiments of the Ontario Government, there is a probability that the deadly mustard weed which causes so much anxiety among farmers, will be a thing of the past within a few years. Professor Todd, provincial farm director, has found a way to kill the mustard seed. Last spring he had a 100-acre farm near Brantford, complete with fields of oats and barley, which were literally yellow with a solution of bluestone or sulphide of copper. This farm has produced very poor crops in the past, but this fall there was an excellent yield and no traces of mustard were found. The weeds are now being killed. The mustard will be tilled on the same farm next spring in an effort to find out whether this solution should be used on all farms in the province.

#### Call of the College

"Oh, why be farmers, stockmen, sawyers?" the college clamors, loud and clear; "why not be editors or lawyers, and wear fine linen all the year? Why soil your hands with the mud of the farm? Why carry swill to cow or hog? Why rise above your tolling neighbors, and be a fourth rate pedagogue? Why wear duck overalls and carry the humpbacked mule and bridle steers? Come to the college in a hurry, and learn to be a bank cashier! Through all the land the boys are dropping the yeoman's tools in deep disgust, resolved to learn the trade of yawning, resolved to wear boiled shirts or bust. Professors all overcrowded; the starving lawyers throng the streets; and there are men in surprise shrouded who should be busy hoeing beans. Stenographers we've by the legion who haven't learned the way to spell; and in the fertile farming region the grangers raise an awful yell. "Send us help," we hear them crying, imploring with ten thousand tongues; "send us the husky skates who're trying to earn their living with their lungs! Send us a gist of half-baked preachers, of lawyers who have known no brief, send us stenographers or stenographers, to shuck the corn of kind the sheaf!" Above the grangers' mournful bawling, above their pleas for working men, we hear the college sweetly calling: "Forsake the plowshare for the pen!"

#### Church Wedding Best

If all marriages were contracted in churches there would be far fewer divorces, is the opinion of Chief Justice Joseph G. Donnelly of the Milwaukee. "Civilized men," he says, "few of our readers will differ with the opinion of the wise Judge of Judging from appearances the opinion of Judge Donnelly will be timely and should be pasted in the hat of several of our young couples. He says: 'There should be first of all parental consent. Then there should be the ceremony performed by a minister in a church before friends of both the man and the woman. There should be the ring and the wedding march and all the other little touches—call them sentimental if you will—that go with the acceptance of a sacred responsibility. And it should have the proper setting. Take the other side of the picture. The young couple rush to the license clerk; possibly just before closing time, to keep it out of the papers. They turn to the nearest judge and apply for a special dispensation. They are taken into his chambers. There is nothing here to remind of the nature or the contract into which they are about to enter. A few musty law volumes, the smell of stale tobacco smoke in the air; perhaps a few minutes before a woman of the under world has sobbed out a pitiful story of sordid shame to a calloused lawyer. What is there in this environment to maintain the impressiveness of the beautiful sacrament of marriage? Will the average man and woman regard the ceremony performed in a law office with that feeling of awe and reverence that must come when two persons meet at God's altar to plight their troth? Sentiment is a strong safeguard and I believe if more marriages were performed in churches there would be fewer divorces.'
