



Branch of the Federal Department of Agriculture will test free of charge samples of seeds of grasses, clovers and cereal crops. This has been the policy of this Branch since the passing of the Seed Control Act. As a guide to growers, dealers and

others who desire to have samples tested for purity, grading and germination, a leaflet of instructions has been prepared. Under twenty-three numbered paragraphs there are described, among other things, how to prepare, pack and address samples of seeds of various kinds. Useful notes are given on qualities affecting the value of seed. It is pointed out that injury to wheat from frost or dampness is usually apparent in color and shrunken condition of the grain. While a hulled kernel of sound oats is usually semi-transparent and not brittle, a frosted kernel is dark and mealy, particularly at the tip, and is uscally brittle. Instructions are given \$2 growers whose farms are not clean are uncleaned condition to a wholesale merchant who has special power cleaners. Persons who desire to have seed tested may procure a copy of this circular by applying for it to the publications branch of the Department of Agriculture, Ottawa.


