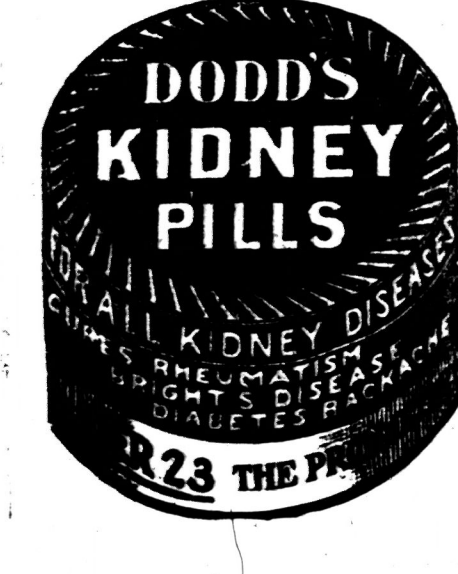

SHE HAD A REASON.

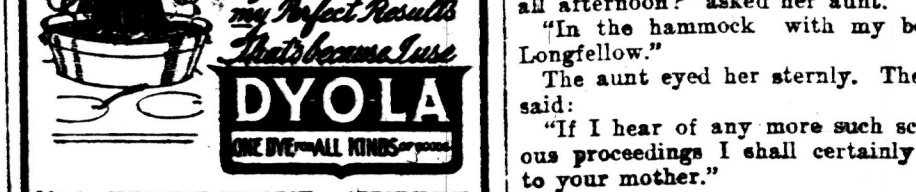

ESKIMO BOY MAKES HIS KAIK.

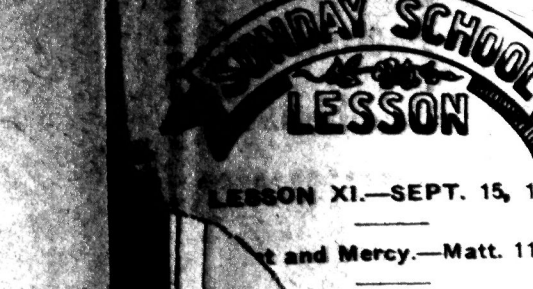
