D. Roulston. Resolved that the resignation of Alan Mair Jackson, Twp. Engineer of Walpole, be accepted.—Carried.

Roulston—McBurney, resolved that the Clerk is hereby instructed to have notices printed and posted, drawing attention to the fact that it is contrary to law to drive on fast paths in the Township of Walpole

and that persons doing so will be prosecuted.—Carried.

Falls—Clark, resolved that this Council purchase 800 yards stone to improve 17th Concession, west of the Plank Road and the sum of \$325 to be used in hauling expenses of the same, and J. J. Parsons and W. D. Roulston be a committee to have the work done.—Carried.

Parsons—McBurney, that the Walpole Council grant to the West Haldimand Plowmen's Association, the sum of \$50.—Carried.

Falls—Clark, resolved that W. D. Roulston and D. McBurney be delegates to attend The Good Roads Convention at Toronto on 28th, 27th and 28th inst.—Carried.

McBurney—Clark, Resolved that we adjourn to meet on Saturday, March 22nd, at 10 a.m., in the Walpole Fire Insurance Hall, Jarvis.—Carried.

Hicks' March Forecasts

There is a reactionary storm period central on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd. This is at the exact center of the great Jupiter period, with the Mars and Earth equinoctial periods in full combined force. Storms all the way from the tropical in the south, should surprise no reader of these forecasts, at this or any other period during this month. This is a time and season when a good, trusty barometer is indispensable in every home and office. A very cold wave will spread over most parts of the country from about the 3rd to the 6th, sweeping from northwest to southeast. Watch for it!

A regular storm period is central on the 8th, involving the 6th to the 11th. Near Moon on the 7th, and Moon on the celestial equator on the 8th, with the Venus period adding its influence to Earth, Mars and Jupiter, violent storms and other disturbances will be natural and certain, from about Friday the 7th to Tuesday the 11th. West India hurricanes should be anticipated on the 9th and 10th. Atlantic coasts, and inland through southern and interior states. Blizzards from the northwest will meet these tropical storms, all ending in high, destructive gales and a March cold wave. Electric and magnetic phenomena will reach a maximum, causing Earth currents, northern lights and many earthquakes between the 7th and the 12th. A marked seismic period extends from the 5th to the 14th, being central on the 7th. Watch your barometer, the temperature, humidity, wind currents and clouds, until this period "shows its hand." Do the same at all the periods in this month.

A reactionary storm period covers the 13th, 14th and 15th. The Moon will be at greatest north declination at this time, hence wind currents will be from southerly points, the temperature will be higher, the barometer will fall, followed by rain and wind, ending in rising barometer and change to much colder for several days following. The Mars period is fading out but the Venus and Earth periods are intensifying. Keep your eyes on all storm clouds, and don't forget your barometer.

A regular storm period involves the 17th to the 23rd. The center of Earth's equinox falls on the 22nd, within two days of the center of the Venus equinox on the 24th. The Moon will be in opposition with Earth and Sun at an eclipse node, on the 22nd, and on the celestial equator and in perigee on the 21st.
