Curfew Age Raised to 16 Years

At the final meeting of the Berlin, Ont., City Council a bylaw was passed amending the curfew bell bylaw, which has been in force over 20 years, by raising the age from 14 to 16 years for boys and girls who will be expected to be at their homes by 9 o'clock at night.

Noted Painter Dead

Pittsburg, Dec. 28—Engene Alonzo Poole, 71, a noted painter of autumn scenes in this country, is dead here today. Friends who called at his studio Tuesday found him ill with pneumonia and took him to a hospital. One of his best known works is a portrait of Chief Justice Morris R. Waite.

Death of Lewis A. Taylor

On Wednesday, Dec. 18th, death came very sudden to one of the old residents of the village in the person Lewis A. Taylor. Mr. Taylor had been around all day and in the evening was sitting by the fire, when without the least warning fell over in his chair unconscious and died within half an hour without speaking a word. Dr. Gould was at once summoned and everything done to revive him, but all to no avail. He was born in Ancaster seventy-five years ago and came to Townsend early in his life. He was married on May 13th, 1861, to Adeline Robinson, and lived on a farm near Beaton continually till 1901, when they moved to Watertown, and have lived here ever since. He was a member of the Watertown Methodist Church. He is survived by his wife and two children, Mrs. Ward Foster, Bradford and Mrs. C. W. Kaufman, Hagersville. One son, Leander K., predeceased him several years ago. The funeral was held Friday afternoon, service being conducted by Rev. J. Trux. Interment took place in Greenwood Cemetery—Watertown Star.
