Housekeepers have combined in Chicago to cut the high cost of living and are prepared to sell a million dozen of April cold storage eggs at 24c per dozen, which is from six to ten cents cheaper than the dealers have been getting. The dealers have risen to the situation by offering the same quality of egg at 22c. The success of the women in Philadelphia and Cleveland will probably lead to the extension of the cooperative movement, and in time it may become a penal offence to be a retail grocer or butcher.

Getting Help for Season

It might be well for the farmers of this country to plan now for their supply of farm help for next season There is no doubt that the scarity of competent farm hands is the most serious problem facing Canadian farmers at the present time, nor does the critical situation show much sign of early improvement. It our farms are to be tilled as they should, and if we as a people are to maintain our ascendancy among the producing nations, we must take measures to provide for an ample supply of farm laborers. How is the average farmer to do his share? The Farmers' Club movement has opened an avenue of action. Where the farmer single-handed could do nothing, the Farmers' Club has great power. For instance, notice has lately come to us of the Farmers' Clubs in Grey county which are making a radical move in this matter. These clubs are canvassing the farmers of the district in order to ascertain the number of farm hands which will be required by that district for the ensuing year. If a sufficient number is called for by the farmers, it is proposed that Mr. Hugh C Duff, district representative for the county, sail for the old country immediately to select and place each man and in this way no farmer requiring help will be overlooked. This is a step on which the county of Grey is to be congratulated, and one which other clubs ordered stomach for which these tablets and countries might profitably consider are especially intended.
