Pittsfield, Mass., July 8. - Rev. Alexander Turnbull. aged 61, a native of Waterford, Ont., and prominent for many years as a Canadian Baptist clergyman and missionary on the frontier of Canada. died in a tragic manner at the House of Mercy, where he had been staying. He suddenly threw up his hands and with a groan fell the floor dead. He had suffered from heart failure for five years. His first pastorate was at Belleville. He studied for the ministry at Simcoe. Ont., attended Woodstock College and graduated at Toronto in 1873. The body was sent to Waterford and interment took place there last week.

A Southern Missouri man was being tried on a charge of assault. The state brought into court as the weapons used a rail, an ax, a pair of the defendance of tongs, a saw and a rifle.
