To Prevent Ivy Poisoning

A reader tells the Boston Transcript that the effects of poison ivy can be best mitigated by the application of golden rod juice. Here is important information if true, and there can be no harm in making the trial, when afflicted. This person found the poison ivy vine to be the bane of his summer vacations, and he failed to quick relief until he learned about and tried the golden rod remedy. Here is his statement: "It is possible to buy extract of golden rod from the druggist, but it invariably takes several days to procure, and to the victim of ivy poison every moment is precious. Just as soon as the poison appears on the itch begins, the sufferer should apply the juice of crushed leaves, blossoms, or stems of the golden rod plant of any species. The poisoned places should be rubbed briskly, and, if the skin is broken, the effectiveness of the golden rod juice will be increased. Frequent applications should be made, and in two or three hours all the soreness and stinging will be gone. If the poison is not recognized until it has a good start it is much harder to cure. Even in this case golden rod will work wonders, but the juice must be more lavishly and frequently applied."

The Street Dress of Some Girls.

A writer in "Everybody's Column" of the Buffalo News, writes the following: earnest and thoughtful appeal to parents and their daughters in regard to the mode of dress adopted by many girls on the street, who also might heed the warning contained. "Once or twice I have seen articles in the News hinting at the absurd way girls of to-day dress, and I would like to go on record as saying, the dress of to-day can only bring about social evils. "This is not putting it too strong and the sooner mothers wake up to the danger the better. What we must not forget is that there is a distinct point of morals in the question of how a girl dresses.
