The early season prospects for the apple crop could not have been better, but the cold weather got in its destructive work and a heavy faiting of resulted."

The report from the Niagara peninsula also states that the outlook for early peaches, including St. John's and and Crawfords is for a light crop. Late peaches promise a uniformly fair yield. In the apple orchards Baldwins and spies are light, but greenings and kings will

The Fruit Branch has worked out the following precentages to show the estimated return on the general crop of the district; Red Currants 73 per cent., gooseberries 70 per cent., raspberries 84 p. c., cherries 76 p. c., Japan plums. 70 p. c., European plums 66 p. c. early peaches 72 p. c., late peaches 76 p. c., pears 75 p. c., grapes 75 p. c., tomatoes 68 p. c.
