Fenian Raid Anniversaries

Forty seven years ago on Tuesday there took place the fight at Ridgeway between some Fenian raiders, who had crossed to Fort Erie from Buffalo, and some companies of Canadian volunteers, who were forced to retire in disorder. The Fenians were under the command of John O'Neill, a veteran officer of the American Civil War. As the crossing of reinforcements to the Fenian invaders were constrained to return to Buffalo, leaving some of their number prisoners in the hands of the Canadian defenders. A few of these were subsequently prosecuted, convicted, and punished for their part in the raid. The real name of the Society called "Fenians" in Ireland was the "Irish Revolutionary Brotherhood." It was organized by Jas. Stephens, who began his work in 1853. In 1858 he transferred his activity to the United States where an allied organization had been commenced under the somewhat fearful title of "Fenians." A considerable amount of money was raised in that country, and the close of the Civil War in 1865 set free many officers and men to take part in the invasion of Canada.—Dunville Press.

Children's Protection Act

Many resolutions have been passed by benevolent and philanthropic organizations, many sermons delivered, many editorials written by leading newspapers and magazines, many personal suggestions made, that at the law dealing with children on the streets and in parks after dark should be more stringent. At the recent session of the Ontario Legislature these numerous requests have been met, and the amended law is as follows:

Sec 16.—No child under sixteen shall loiter in any public place after 9 o'clock in the evening, or be there unless accompanied by his parent or guardian to accompany any such child.

A child found in a public place after the hour named in subsection 1 unless so accompanied may be warned to go home by any constable or probation officer or officer of a Children's Aid Society, and if after such warning the child is found loitering in a public place such child may be taken to its home, or the Children's Shelter.

A parent who permits his child to violate this section shall for the first offence incur a penalty of \$1 without costs, for a second offence \$2, and for a third, or any subsequent offence, \$5.

Sec 2.—"Public place" shall mean a street, highway or lane, whether a thoroughfare, or not, and a tavern or other place of public resort, and generally any place to which the public have or are permitted to have access.

Work for the Nervons.

The popular doctrine for a long time has been that for nervous persons rest is a necessity. This doctrine has been embodied in the famous Weir Mitchell cure, says Rev. S. S. McComb in Harper's Bazaar. And, doubtless, for certain cases rest should be commended—as, for example, in certain acute exhaustive states of the nervous system, where there is a genuine or physical fatigue as distinguished from physical fatigue.

But modern students are more and more coming to realize that not absolute rest but modified rest—that is to say, rest and work combined—is the sovereign remedy for nervous disorders. The great majority of persons who suffer from neurasthenia complain of a sense of fatigue, and they naturally infer that what they need above all things is rest, or cessation from activity; but they forget that, in a vast majority of instances, the fatigue does not spring out of any real muscular weakness, but rather from physical or mental causes.

Work, again, is the enemy of insomnia. The sufferer from bad or broken sleep is liable to give up duties or to be slack in their performance, to abandon exercise and forget his usual hobbies, because of his anticipation of a night of distress. In the reality, he ought to prepare himself for sleep by congenial activity, in which his mind will be weaned away from the fear of not sleeping.

Once more, work is an enemy to the fears and impulsions, to the strange sense of unreality and other morbid symptoms which accompany psychasthenia. Work restores to such a sufferer "the function of the real." It is only through contact with reality that man, whether normal or abnormal, can find abiding satisfaction.
