THE YOUNGEST PEERESS

BARONESS FURNIVALL IS ONLY THIRTEEN YEARS OLD.

Long Dormant Barony, Which Has Lain In Abeyance Since 1777, Has Been Revived by a Decision of the House of Lords and Little Girl Assumes Place on the British Roll of Nobles.

The Hon. Mary Frances K. Petre, the daughter of Audrey Lady Petre, becomes Baroness Furnivall by the announcement that the King has determined in her favor the abeyance now existing in the barony of Furnivall. She becomes the youngest peeress on the roll in her own right. The barony of Furnivall has been in abeyance since 1777. The claim to it by Audrey Lady Petre on behalf of her daughter was heard last December by the Committee for Privileges of the House of Lords, which held that the barony should be dated as from 1295. The new peeress in her own right is the only daughter of the fourteenth Lord Petre, who married in June, 1890, Audrey, daughter of the Rev. William R. Clark, D.D., formerly vicar of Taunton and prebendary of Wells, and who died in 1908. She will be thirteen years of age next month.

Keeping the Devil Away. Some of the more out of the way parts of Cornwall, England, can offer many singular sights to the visitor. None of these is more curious, however, than that which is to be seen in the small village of Veryan, in the southern part of the county, says The Wide World Magazine.

On each side of the main roads which lead to the group of cottages clustered round the church there are to be seen certain queer looking round houses, each surmounted by a cross. These cottages were built with the object of keeping the devil out of the village! More than 100 years ago the vicar of the parish was a certain Mr. Jeremiah Trist, a person who seems to have been a most worthy man, though curiously superstitious. In spite of all his endeavors to make his parishioners good, it seemed that the village folk did not improve very rapidly, and he decided that something must be done to right matters.

Accordingly, after much cogitation, the famous round houses were built. With these in position, protected by their crosses, it was urged that the evil one would not dare to enter the village, and therefore all would be well in Veryan. Whether the good year's hopes were realized, it is, unfortunately, impossible to say, but the houses stand today as a singular instance of an attempt to banish the powers of darkness.

Indifferent To Politics. The football season in England is now over, but Lord Halsbury is much concerned because, while many thousands of people attend football matches, they display an amazing apathy in regard to politics. He suggested, during a recent speech, that many followers of football do not care a farthing what takes place in the Houses of Parliament, and he thought it showed a degree of great deterioration. All they seemed to trouble about was, not how they were governed, but how they could amuse themselves.

Thoughtful people will doubtless recognize that there is much truth in Lord Halsbury's comments, although at the same time it is to be feared that the person who suggested to the working man that he should study politics on Saturday afternoon instead of attending a football or cricket match would not be affectionately welcomed, to say the least.

A Terrace of Them. A curiosity of nest building that is probably unique has just been discovered at one of Messrs. Chivers & Sons' farms near Cambridge, England. Within a short distance of the jam factory six fruit baskets were tied together and hung in a cart shed, where a number of men are often at work. In every one of these baskets a bird has built its nest, and in two cases the nests have eggs. The builders include blackbirds, song thrushes, and mistle thrushes, and as the baskets are being left alone, it is hoped that each mother will hatch out her brood.

Telegraphing Round the World. The most widely separated points between which a telegram can be sent are British Columbia and New Zealand. The telegram would cross North America, Newfoundland, the Atlantic, Great Britain, Germany, Russia, European and Asiatic-China, Japan, Java and Australia. It would make nearly a circuit of the globe and would traverse over 20,000 miles in doing so.
