AUTHORS' WIVES.

Many Cases of Successful Literary Partnerships Are Recorded.

Some authors have freely acknowledged their indebtedness to their wives. It is admitted by the most cynical that women make excellent critics and that their judgment is usually sound. "Moliere," said Addison, "used to read all his comedies to his old housekeeper, as she sat with him at her work by the chimney corner; and he could tell the success of his play in the theatre from the reception with which it met at his fire-side, for he observed that the audience always followed the old woman, and never failed to laugh in the same place."

Tom Hood had such confidence in his wife's judgment that he read and re-read and corrected with her all he wrote. Many of his articles were first dictated to her, and her ready memory supplied him with his references and quotations. He frequently dictated the first draft of his articles, although they were always finally copied out in his peculiarly clear, neat writing.

Macaulay read all his articles to his sister before sending them to the press; and Anthony Trollope said that no person but his wife had ever read a line of his manuscript, "to my very great advantage in matters of taste." The most noteworthy examples of joint authorship are those of Samuel Carter and Anna Maria Hall and of William and Mary Howitt. Mr. and Mrs. Hall worked together for fifty-six years, and wrote not fewer than three hundred and forty volumes. Unlike the great majority of "women of mind," Mrs. Howitt ably discharged her domestic duties. "My wife," boasted Mr. Howitt, "is the best poetess and the best housewife in England."

The novelist, Alphonse Daudet, had determined to remain a bachelor, because he was afraid that if he made a wrong step in marriage, he might dull his imagination. He has given expression to his fear in the "Femmes d'Artistes," and more particularly in the tale "Madame Heurtise," with which the volumes opens. But, on being introduced to Mademoiselle Julie Allard, who loved literature, and was herself a charming writer and critic, his fear was removed. The union proved a very happy one, and the picture of the two at work is an attractive bit of biography. "She has been," says his brother, "the light of his heart, his brother of his work, and the discreet counselor of his inspiration. There is not a page that she has not revised, retouched, and enlivened; and her husband has borne witness to her devotion and indefatigable collaboration in the dedication of 'The Nabob'; but she would not allow this dedication to appear."

Once, it is related, he had a sentimental and dramatic scene with his wife, concerning which he remarked—"This seems my dear, like a chapter that has slipped out of a novel."

City's Odd Industry.

The pre-eminence of Birmingham in the manufacture of guns and jewelry, pens and bedsteads is known all over the world, but a number of small articles are also produced, some of which are of a decidedly curious character, and for which the Birmingham maker has to some extent created his own market.

For example, it is not generally known that Birmingham is the principal source of the jew's-harp. For sixty years the industry has been carried on in the vicinity of Ashtedon, a venerable quarter of the city, by members of the Troman family. Originally the industry came from Halesowen, and the jew's-harps are still made in a little home smithy strongly reminiscent of its Black Country origin. Great Britain is no longer the best market, enormous quantities being exported, especially to half-civilized countries. The Zulu musician, for example, has taken very kindly to the jew's-harp, and needs a specially large size to suit his somewhat capacious mouth.

Victor Emmanuel II.'s Moustache. Sir Frederick Carrington is said to have possessed the finest moustache in the British army. It was not so long, however, as that worn by Victor Emmanuel II., whom the Duchess of Sutherland described as "the only knight of the Garter I have ever seen who looked as if he would certainly have the best of it with the dragon."

The first ruler of United Italy allowed his moustache to attain such a length that in his later years he would never eat anything at a public banquet. He was obliged to tie his moustache behind his head when taking food, and this he thought looked undignified in front of people not belonging to his own circle.—London Globe.

Barrister Aged 102.

Mr. W. A. G. Hake, who is now 102, is easily the oldest living English barrister. He is a cousin of Gen. Gordon, lives at Brighton, which seems to make a speciality of residents who have long passed the allotted span, and has still sufficient vitality to brush aside influenza and bronchitis and little troubles of that nature. The curious in these matters will be interested to learn that he attributes his long life and good health to abstemiousness and plenty of exercise.

Campbell's Bulls.

Two good "bulls" are attributed to the late Sir George Campbell. On one occasion he had been calling attention in the House of Commons to some scheme in Indian administration, and proceeded to observe that he had further revelations to make concerning other scandals, in comparison with which this one was "a mere flea bite in the ocean." Another time when speaking about military affairs in India, he declared that "the pale face of the British soldier was the backbone of our Indian army."
