Hicks' May Forecasts

A reactionary storm period is central on the 9th, 10th and 11th. The Mercury equatorial prior begins in a reactionary period, a plus added influence will be noticeable in a quick, prolonged cloudiness, with a tendency to drizzle and rain. But for the fact that solar conditions are annually intensified, in all the central states, in the month of May, the causes of the heavy storms are at a minimum at this time. But it is always wise to watch storm developments in May, especially when we are passing through, and are near the centre of a Jupiter period. Very cool nights with probable frosts northward, will come with the high barometric area behind these storms.

Killed At Port Colbourne

A fatal accident occurred on Friday at the Maple Leaf flour mill, Port Colbourne when one of the employees was instantly killed. The unfortunate man was Frederick Ball. He was working by himself in the room where the wheat is received from the elevator, and then elevated to an upper floor. The flow of wheat to the upper floor was checked and upon investigation Ball was found badly crushed. He had apparently tried to jump over a travelling belt, which caught him and whirled him against the ceiling, killing him instantly and badly mauling his body.

An inquest was considered unnecessary. He is survived by a widow, having only been married about five weeks. Deceased was born in Egypt and had served in the British army. Ball resided in Dunnville for some time before removing to Port Colbourne, and was married there to Mrs. Hawkins of this place. — Chronicle
