Carried Birchall's Secret To The Grave.

Rev. Canon Wade, formerly rector of the Church of Ascension, died at his home in Hamilton on April 24, taking with him to the grave the secret confided to him by Birchall, who was hanged at Woodstock for the murder of Benner. Canon Wade was one of the chief figures in that noted case. He was the chaplain who walked to the scaffold with the murderer. Just before Birchall paid for his crime with his life, he made a private statement to Canon Wade. What passed between the two Canon Wade would never disclose. William Henry Wade was born in England in 1851 and came to this country when a young man. After receiving his education he prepared himself for the ministry of the Anglican Church. His first charge was at Burford where he was located from 1885 to 1887. He then went to Woodstock, remaining there until 1892. On November 14th, 1892, he assumed the rectorship of the Church of the Ascension of this city, which office he retained until failing health compelled his retirement.
