County Council

Cayuga, May 1st, 1913.

Council met at the call of the Warden, pursuant to adjournment, all members being present except Mr. Holmes.

The minutes of the former meeting were read.

Hornbrook-Bain—That minutes of last meeting be adopted as read—Carried.

The following communications were read: Letters from J. J. Parsons, Steel and Radiation Co., W. A. McLean, Rouleten-Buckner. That the communications be referred to a committee composed of Messrs. Kett, Werner and Root—Carried.

Bain-Hornbrook—That an Erie Telephone be installed in Mr. Snider's office and that the Bell Telephone at present in his office be discontinued at end of present contract—Carried.

Werner-Bain—That this council do now adjourn to allow the General Committee to meet—Carried.

Sorge-Root—That Council do now resume business with the Warden in the chair—Carried.

Avery-Lett—That the report of Road and Bridge Committee be received and read—Carried.

To the Warden and Gentlemen of the County Council.

Gentlemen—We, your Road and Bridge Committee, recommend the following: That Mr. Sorge be authorized to have the approaches to the Middaugh Creek Bridge put in a good state of repair. Also recommend that Mr. Runchey be paid \$684.00 to apply on contract price of Black Creek bridge. That Messrs. Buckner, Root, Hornbrook and the chairman be a committee to meet a Committee of the Warden and Council on county line at Kelly creek bridge. Respectfully submitted—Wm. Bain, Chairman.

Cline-McBurney—That the report of the Road and Bridge Committee be adopted—Carried.

Rouleten-Kett—That the report of the County Roads Committee be received and read—Carried.

Work being done by the Superintendent to the present date and the purchase of machinery bought of H. W. Petrie, Toronto.

One crusher, capacity from 100 to 150 tons; one Napinee steam drill 3 1/2 x 6 and hose, 300ft; 1/2 in. wire rope, 100ft; 1 in. iron pipe; one Scotch derrick, 35 ft. boom with wheel and fittings, one steam hoist, 6 1/2 x 8 cylinder with boiler, guaranteed to lift two tons on single wire; timber, 90 ft. x 9 ft. stone bin at Nelles Corners; 3,000 feet of lumber from J. Grant for building at Nelles Corners; in the last three weeks have covered 79 miles of road; have also employed teams to scrape earth off quarry at Nelles Corners; all machinery is unloaded except crusher and hoist. The hoist is at Dunnville station.—M. Runchey.

To the Warden and Members of the County of Haldimand, assembled:

Your good road committee have met and beg leave to report as follows:—That we have purchased one Improved Mitchell crusher at a cost of \$1,000.00 and elevator \$295.00; purchased from W. H. Petrie Co., Toronto, one two ton Scotch derrick made by J. T. Hepburn, with 35 foot boom, at a cost of \$240.00; one steam

drill made by the Napinee Co., at a cost of \$215.00; one steam hoist and boiler, 6 1/2 x 8 cylinder, at a price of \$675; 100 ft. of wire rope at \$2.95; one Watrous steam road roller, 10 tons, and the County to have 6 days' expert services from the firm at a cost of \$2,750.00; one 40 horse power boiler and engine, all complete for the sum of \$400.00, from Mr. Ranney. All of which we respectfully submit—Wm. Walton, Chairman.

Shipway-Smelser—That the report of the County Road Committee as read be adopted—Carried.

Werner-Avery—That the report of the County Road Committee be received and read—Carried.

To the Warden and Council.

Gentlemen—Your Finance Committee beg leave to report as follows:

Spencer, do., \$4; J. Lutley, do., \$6.00; Hamilton Bridge Works, Hamilton, steel structures, \$1000; A. F. Carter, Cayuga, clock for registry office, \$9.20; J. H. Kelson, Parliament Bldg., Toronto, keep of McKee, \$1.50; Municipal Ward, St. Thomas, seal for 4th Division Court \$5; Treasurer of Toronto, removal of L. G. The committee wish to draw the attention of the Council that no monies have been received from the Government on Criminal Justice Account for over a year and would recommend that some action be taken. Respectively submitted—D. W. McBurney, Chairman.

Kett-Rouleten—That the report of the Finance Committee be adopted as read—Carried.

Bain-Sorge—That a further sum of \$4,000 be taken up on the credit obtained by the County from the Canadian Bank of Commerce, and that the Warden and Treasurer sign a note for the same.—Carried.

Werner-McBurney—That whereas the cost of administration of Criminal Justice in the County of Haldimand amounts to a large sum in the course of a year, and the portion repayable by the Government of the Province of Ontario to the County is an important item in the resources of the (continued from page eight)
