### Is Divorce Granted in the States Valid Here

Toronto, Nov. 13.—Is a divorce secured by a Canadian in a United States Court valid in Canada, if the divorce went to the States for that purpose? This is the question which Judge Denton has been called upon to decide in the case of Annie E. Clisdell, against Fred W. Clisdell, for \$6000, claimed on an agreement whereby the latter was to pay \$600 a year to Mrs. Clisdell as long as she remained unmarried. According to the evidence, Mrs. Clisdell had been deserted by a former husband who had decamped to South Africa, and failed to send her anything for her support. Wishing to marry Clisdell, she went to Detroit, lived there two years, and then secured a divorce in that city. Coming back to Toronto, the pair went through a form of marriage. Their married life was unhappy, and they agreed on a separation, Clisdell to pay the \$600 a year which is in dispute. "I believed the woman was my wife when I signed that agreement, but have since learned that the Detroit divorce was not valid," declared Clisdell. Counsel for Clisdell argued that as both parties in the Detroit divorce were domiciled in Canada at the time, the American court had no jurisdiction and could not grant a divorce. "How about the fact that she lived in Detroit two years?" asked his Honor. "That does not change her place of domicile, as he went for the specific purpose of securing a divorce," replied the lawyer. "Also a woman cannot change her domicile in the absence of her husband, and Blackwell was then in South Africa, which is British territory."

By the King's command and in accordance with the wishes of Prince and Princess Arthur of Connaught, a cheque for \$100,000 was sent to the Lord Mayor in aid of the Bazaar fund as a first installment from the money received from the visitors viewing the Royal wedding processions at St. James' Palace.

Approximately four and one-half tons of gold—valued at \$1,000,000 worth in all—arrived at the Royal Bank, Montreal, on Saturday, from London and New York.

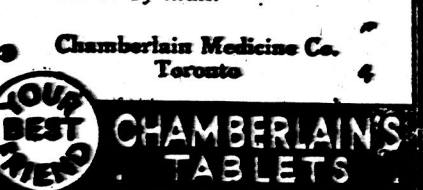
