To the Editors of Jarvis Record

Dear Madam—Will you please let me have a space in your paper to speak about Tuberculosis and of patients affected by the disease.

At the lecture given on Tuberculosis, measures were given to prevent the spreading of the disease and of protecting ourselves and others from contracting the disease. Had time permitted there is no doubt another half dozen of preventatives would have been suggested, wherein the dangers of the disease spreading could be checked and would lessen the number of patients.

Knowing our bodies are so susceptible to taking the disease, it is to our interest to do all in our power to keep ourselves in the best of health.

But there are times when this is impossible for some to do. Where the bread winner and help of the employer are concerned, is the place of work kept as free of germs as could be if the employer would have it properly cleaned.

Of course it is easy to get ventilation, but not always so easy to keep the body because the body is not heated to the necessary heat the body requires. Gas bills are not so large that it is right to keep help that are always uncomfortable for the want of heat. The outcome is this, time is all that is needed in adding cold after cold, not always a barking cough gradually settles in the weak part of the body. Just as you pay your help and expect their work and time, it is no more than right that you should have the work place properly ventilated and heated.

This is not striking any one personally, and go to the cities, towns, villages and country you can find places of stint given where the help is concerned. There is a saying an ounce of prevention is as good as a pound of cure. Measures of prevention of tuberculosis is also prevention to other diseases of the germ nature that is so prevalent in our midst as tuberculosis. There were two remarks passed, not by the lecturer, one of a case in the community at the present time among small children.

Did not the lecturer show how prevention in a home can be increased, also he was sure patients were so anxious to prevent friends from contracting the disease by being willing to use preventive measures. His is a good work. A doctor or a minister can kindly speak to any, if there are any that are ignorant of the care that should be exercised in regard to any infectious disease. Thank God there are kind hearts yet in the world. The author.
