Japer Park la Canadale House His

It is Canada's gain that conserva-tion — that mutually profitable co-operation of nature and man — had begun to come into its own while yet the country possessed thousands of square miles of secluded animal havens and untouched forest. Can-als has seen in other countries the teardrop of experience in time to protect the quiet breath of nature's

It was thirty years ago that this country stepped in with a determination to retain some of her native simplicity. The first transcontinental, the Canadian Pacific Railway, was siming for the Rocky Mountains on its way to the Pacific coast. The mountains of British Columbia were utterly unknown, except where a few intrepid engineers !ad struggled through in search of a way for the steel. But even the slow-making wheels of officialdom began to revolve in time, and steel was still away out on the prairie when, in one quick revolution, the entire easter 1 slope of tife Rockies was set apart as a huge reserve, a five-hundred-mile strip where the native wealth of the country might find permanence and peace. But not for twenty-five years or more did that first bold stroke of wisdom develop into a complete system of conservation able to meet all con-

tingencies that could arise from sud-

den corporate or individual greed. In 1900 the construction of transcontinental lines became the policy of the two other great Canadian railways. One hundred and fifty miles north of the C.P.R. line the Yellowhead Pass was discovered to offer a way to the Pacific through mountains and valleys that had scarcely even been seen. The approach to the Rockies from the prairies was included in the blanket reservation of the early 'eighties, but so far north there had never been found necessary any formal system of protection for game and forest; and the construction camps of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway were fast nearing this unappraised treasure house without a legal guardian of the old informal law in

Once more the wheels began to turn, and again a single sweeping movement established special protection for five thousand square miles along the route to be followed by the new railway. Before the first marks of construction, rangers were sent into this area, and to Canada has been preserved a realm of primeval rlory probably unsurpassed on the imerican continent.

Jasper Park, as it was named, com menced about 200 miles west of Edmonton, Alberta. Westward it continned to the summit of the Yellowhead Pass, the dividing line between Alberta and British Columbia, and the watershed that sends its streams in one direction to the Pacific Ocean and in the other far up to the Arctic.

Jasper Park derives its name from man whose life was spent in the shadow of the Rockies, and whose memory is preserved in much of the nomenclature of the district. In 1817 of the Hudson Bay trading post estabished seventeen years before in the centre of what is now the park. Dawes' industry and his popularity among the Indians made this post one of the most profitable in the posession of the company.

It was from his shock of yellow hair came the name Yellowhead, applied to the pass he discovered, a lake and a river. The French of it, Tete Jaune, attached itself to a valley fifty miles beyond the summit, to an Indian village near which Dawes established a cache, and now to one of those blights of civilization, an endof-steel village. His first name of Jasper came to the park and to its argest lake.




