Poles and C Poles-Ties

In 1912, there were purchased in Canada 600,550 poles and 21,200,471 cross-ties at a total cost of nearly ten and one half million dollars. In the case of poles, cedar composed 50 per cent of the total, the average cost of the eastern and western species being, respectively \$1.92 and \$2.33. This is a large price to pay for a stick of timber averaging less than twenty-five feet in length, but durability is required and cedar is the most durable wood in Canada. Balsam fir is probably the least durable, and up to 1912 was not used for poles at all. But its form, lightness and cheapness are all that could be desired, so in 1912 thirty-eight thousand poles were purchased and treated with preservatives in order to render them immune from decay. In 1910 practically no ties were treated with preservatives; in 1912, however, 8.5 per cent, or 1,818,180 ties, received treatment. This was due to the increasing cost of jack pines and cedar ties, which in 1912 made up over 50 per cent of the total number purchased with an average value of 44 cents and 45 cents respectively. It was necessary to find some cheaper wood which by treatment with creosote or zinc chloride would give as long or longer service than cedar or jack pine. As yet chiefly hardwoods are treated because when rendered impervious to decay, their superior strength enables them to resist mechanical wear for a longer period than softwoods. But the softwoods or conifers, can be rendered up as resistant to decay, and when tie plates are more commonly used to prevent wear of ties, such softwoods will, on account of their cheapness and abundance, supersede the expensive and rapidly diminishing hardwoods.

Radium Emanation in Medicine

The distinguished English surgeon, Sir Frederick Treves, recently stated that radium emanation is just as effective for curative purposes as radium itself. Assuming that radium is really the valuable therapeutic agent which it appears to be, the announcement is of great importance. Radium is extremely precious, for a small quantity of radium can produce practically an unlimited amount of very cheap emanation. Radium emanations contained in sealed metal applicators are being sent off daily to all parts of England for medical men to use on their patients who cannot attend the Radium Institute. In a space of ten days emanations equal in curative value to \$80,000 worth of radium have been sent out. Radium emits three sets of rays, designated respectively by the Greek letters, "alpha," "beta," and "gamma." The first two destroy the healthy tissues of the body when directed at close range, and at greater distance stimulate the abnormal tissues of tumors to renewed growth. The "gamma" rays are those which are desired. The more or less undesirable "alpha" and "beta" rays are filtered out by lead screens, thru which the hard "gamma" radiations pass easily.

Child Labor

Legislation to protect women and minors from conditions of labor that are oppressive or injurious to health is becoming commendably frequent. It is "parental" legislation, but here, at least, the term contains no condemnatory innuendo. The restriction and regulation of child labor is the aim of a nation wide organized effort. There is no need of it, for the evil that is designated to remedy is terrible, and no one knows the full extent of it. Children are put at tasks too heavy for their immature bodies, are employed too many hours a day, and too many hours at a stretch, and they are kept at work when they should be in bed. They are engaged in occupations that endanger their limbs and even their lives, and in trades and buildings so unsanitary as to undermine their constitutions before they reach adult growth. All this must be changed unless the Canadian race is to lose its sturdy strength and begin to degenerate. But, unfortunately, it is not so easy to devise a remedy as it is to see the evil. It does not solve the problem to enact a law that no child shall work before he has attained a certain age, or to say that minors shall not work before or after certain hours of the day; and it would require a volume to specify the occupations in which a boy may and those in which he may not be employed.
