Of the seventeen cases considered this year, clemency or commutation of sentence has been extended in the case of several, while a few are still more under consideration Notable among these is that of Charles Gibson of Toronto, to whom a reprieve was granted until Oct. 8 on an application for a new trial.

H. & B. at St. Anns, the construction of this section being well advanced, there being thirteen miles now graded and ties distributed along about twelve miles. The bridges and other structual work are practically completed, the design of construction having been approved by the government railway board. 
