Are Judges Liable to Income Taxation

Justice Lennox to Hear Appeal of Lambton County Judge Against Action of Sarnia.

Toronto, Sept. 18.—Under the Ontario Assessment Act are county judges liable to be assessed on their incomes as judges? This, in effect, is a question raised by Judges MacWatt and Taylor, of Lambton, who appealed to the court of revision from assessment by the town of Sarnia. The assessor was upheld and following the course prescribed by the statute, the judges then appealed to a county judge.

F. Aylesworth for the town of Sarnia, this morning appealed to Mr. Justice Kelly at Osgoode Hall for an order appointing a disinterested party to hear the appeal. The application was assented to by F. W. Harcourt, K. C., representing the judges. His Lordship named Mr. Justice Lennox to hear the appeal at the next sitting.

Nixon Man Dies

At London Fair

Thomas Atkinson, a stableman in the employ of J. Herbert Smith, of Delhi, Ont., died at midnight Wednesday last week in a stable of the Queen City Oil Co. on York street. Atkinson hailed from Nixon, and was in charge of the Smith string of horses being shown at the Western Fair. The horses under his charge were stabled in the Queen City barns, that are being used as overflow stables for the Fair horse sheds.

At ten o'clock the man returned to the barns from up town. He complained of illness and Dr. Homer Black was called. He examined the man, treated him, and left him apparently relieved. Two hours later he was again summoned. This time the man had taken a turn for the worse and died.

Coroner Dr. Robert Ferguson was notified of the circumstances of death and investigated. After taking the case up with County Crown Attorney J. B. McKillop, an inquest was decided unnecessary.—London Advertiser.

A Narrow Escape

John Boyer River Road, Dunn, had an exciting ride Thursday evening last. As he was approaching the G.T.R. tracks on Tamarac st., with a load of tomatoes for the canning factory, his team of young horses became frightened at an engine, which was partially upon the highway, and became unmanageable. Turning up the track and leaving tomatoes scattered along the track, they took to the ditch, but had not travelled far ere they came in contact with a telephone pole, which caused them to halt. Mr. Boyer, who is a man nearing the allotted span of life, had just recently rallied from quite a prolonged illness, and this may cause a serious set-back to him. 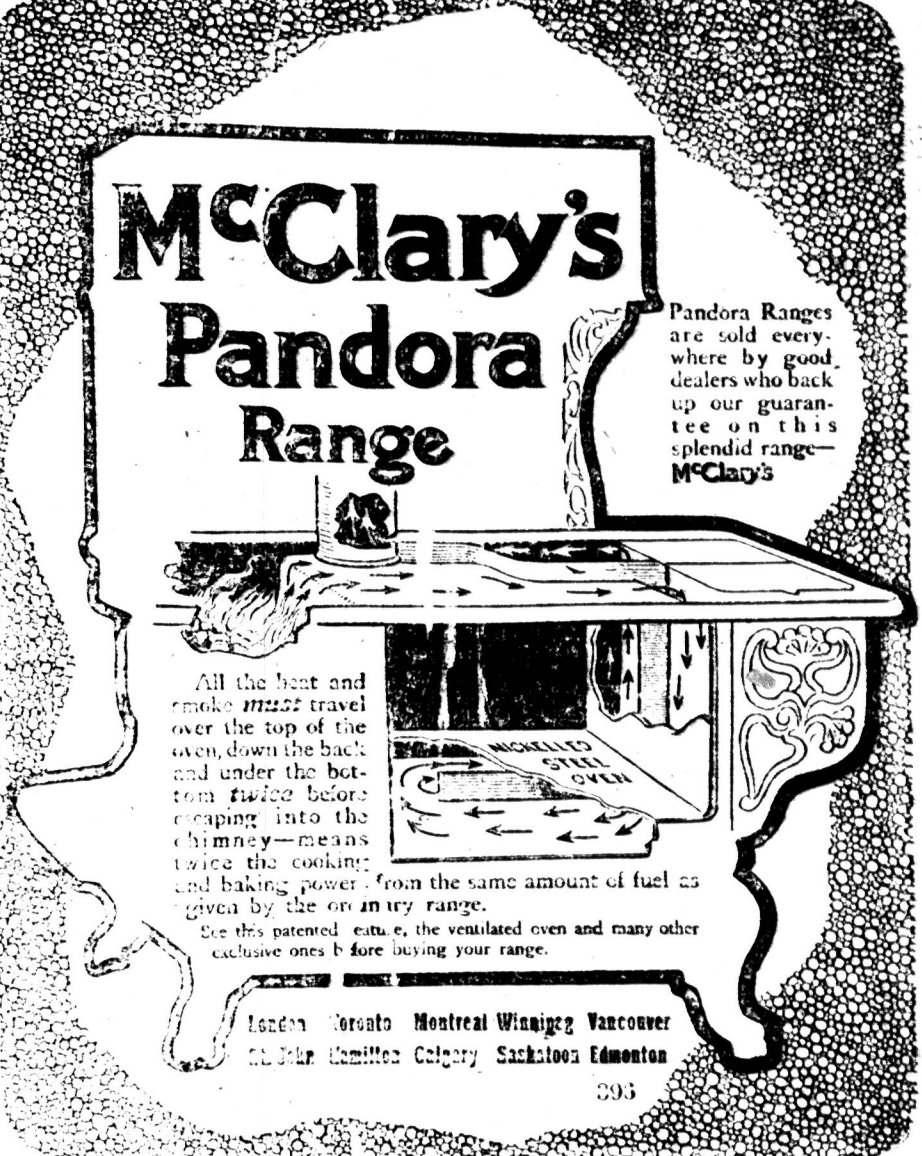
