

My business started in one room over in an,old building on a back street and now we occupy every inch of this five-storey building in one of the best corners in town. Now, young mna, I've talke advertising to some scores of men with ail sorts of schemes and there's not one to thme could convince m: that there's any kind of advertising that would do our bus ness any good." Such were the remarks, in effect, which the head of a large manufact uring concern handed out recently 'e printing steeman who called on ! im n reference to getting out a cata logue to the trade, Although th salesman tried every line of argumen and received a fair hearing it was no avail. The "prospect" seemed absolutely hopeless.

The unfortunate part of it was that the "old man's" statements appeare to be substantiated by the facts. He really had built up a large business in the comparatively short space of twenty-eight years without the aid of advertising, except in a very lim ited degree. There were several reas ons which should be understood, how. ever, and each of them should be of some signifance to us all.

It is reasonably certain that th firm might have boasted of severa more storeys, representing a muc larger business, had they had the air all those years of the white light o judicious advertising. Secondly the nan at the head was an expert in his line-one whom no other could ever approach in inventive genius and the noroughness of workmanship; one o the old school that is rapidly passing way. Also there had been no competion at first and very little in later years. The articles manufacture were necessities, however, and there ire at present three stron competiors to the original makers.

In the light of these facts here is where the value of advertising comes n and the answer can be given to ou riend, Mr. No-ad, even if he does refuse to be convinced. His difficulty s that he is looking backward, no forward. He is living in the past, no the present and fature. It is conceiv anle that within the next few years wwith strong competition from the three firms in question, his concermay suffer a desided drop in sales for, though he still possesses the ad-


