The remainder of the time is spent in hibernating, during which time all food is refused.

REPAIRING WARSHIPS

Huge Dredging-Cranes Can be Taken Clear Out of Water.

Among the greatest engineering marvels of to-day are the gigantic floating docks owned by the British Admiralty and utilized for the repair of naval vessels. The biggest type of these docks has a minimum lifting capacity of 32,000 tons, and is capable of lifting a battleship like H.M.S. Lion, which displacement over 20,000 tons, high and dry out of the water to a height of 36 feet in three hours and ten minutes, thus permitting every part of the vessel's hull to be accessible.

Some idea of the labor involved in the construction of one of these huge docks may be gathered from the fact that there is a first class carpenter, takes about two and a half years to build, it takes two or three times as long to construct a floating dock of a size sufficient to receive the vessel.

A floating dock may be likened to a box with neither ends nor lid. It is built of steel throughout, the largest type having a length of 680 feet and a width of 144 feet, while the walls are 60 feet in height.

The dock is first submerged by admitting water into the ballast tanks, of pontoons forming the base of the structure. When it has been sunk to a sufficient depth to receive the vessel, the latter is warped into its correct position on the keel blocks of the dock, and is then made fast. Powerful pumps are set to work to eject water from the pontoons, causing the structure to rise gradually with its burden. To lift a battleship the size of the Lion 46,000 tons of water has to be pumped out of the pontoons.

TRANSPORTATION

The transportation arrangements of the British Government in connection with the war have extorted the general admiration for the precision and adequacy which marked them. A million men have been moved to France, and yet not a single life has been lost. The man responsible for this wonderful organization, or "Director of Transports," with the official salary of just \$6,000, is Mr. Graeme Thomson, "one of the discoverers of the war," according to Mr. Winston Churchill.

As Mr. Churchill said in the British House of Commons, this war had entailed "performances and transactions, the like of which were never contemplated by any state in history."

HINDU EGG DANCE.

Of the many wonderful feats performed by Hindu jugglers one of the most remarkable is the egg dance. Usually it is executed by a girl, fantastically dressed. She makes use of a willow wisp, around which at equal distances are threads, and at the end of each thread there is a noose held open by a bead.

This wheel the girl places on her head, while she carries a basket of eggs on her arm. When the music strikes up she begins to dance, and the wheels begin to spin around. She then takes an egg from the basket, places it in one of the thread nooses and throws it from her with sufficient force to draw the knot tight. The spinning of the wheels keeps the thread stretched with the egg at the end of it.

She then takes another egg from the basket, places it in another noose and repeats this until there is an egg in every noose. Her fantastic costume, her perfect motion and all the eggs swinging on stretched threads at once present a curious sight.

It requires much art to execute the dance, for one false step would cause the eggs to be dashed together and the dancer to be disgraced. After dancing for some time with all the eggs swing round her head, she takes them out of the noose one by one, all the time keeping the wheel balanced and in motion, and again places them in the basket on her arm. After the performance the spectators are allowed to examine the eggs to see that they are real.—London Ideas.
