### Death of F. Harrison

The death of Mr. Frederick Harrison on Wednesday of last week removed one of the early pioneers of WWalpole, a man highly respected and esteemed. His death came suddenly. He ate his supper as usual but was taken with a serious coughing spell, passing away before a physician arrived.

The subject of this sketch was born in London, England, on June 9th, 1835, and came to Hal. Co. County about 1841 with his parents. He was married in 1858 to Miss Elizabeth Kirkley and moved to Walpole township in 1860, taking up the homestead which has been his home ever since. There came to Walpole township about the same time from old Traill, his life-long neighbors, the Nixons, Fords, Clark, Langs, Walbrooks, Garbutts, Sella, and Aikens.

Blessed with a family of twelve the happy couple built a home that has been widely known for its hospitality. Such a man is a true patriot. May Canada continue to have such stalwart sons, then shall she live forever. Besides his beloved wife he leaves to mourn his departure three sons: George at home, James of Jarvis, Richard of Salt Lake City, Utah, an six daughters—Mrs. J. H. Snell, Mrs. Wm. Hubank of Walpole, Miss Esther, of White Plains, N.Y., Mrs. John Williamson and Miss Bessie of Toronto, Miss Zeta, of McLeod, Alta. and being present at the funeral. exact t. (lower), of Burlington, and two boys: Mrs. Wm. of Palmero and Thomas of Hagersville. Four of the daughters are graduate nurses and have had great success in their chosen profession.

The deceased was a staunch conservative and gave very generously of time and talent to the township and the Walpole Fire Insurance Company affairs. He was also an authority on the Culture, making a great success of that undertaking. We shall greatly miss his genial greetings and are assured that the family have the sincerest sympathy in their bereavement.

The funeral took place on Monday last at Chalmers' Church Cemetery and was largely attended.—Hagersville News.

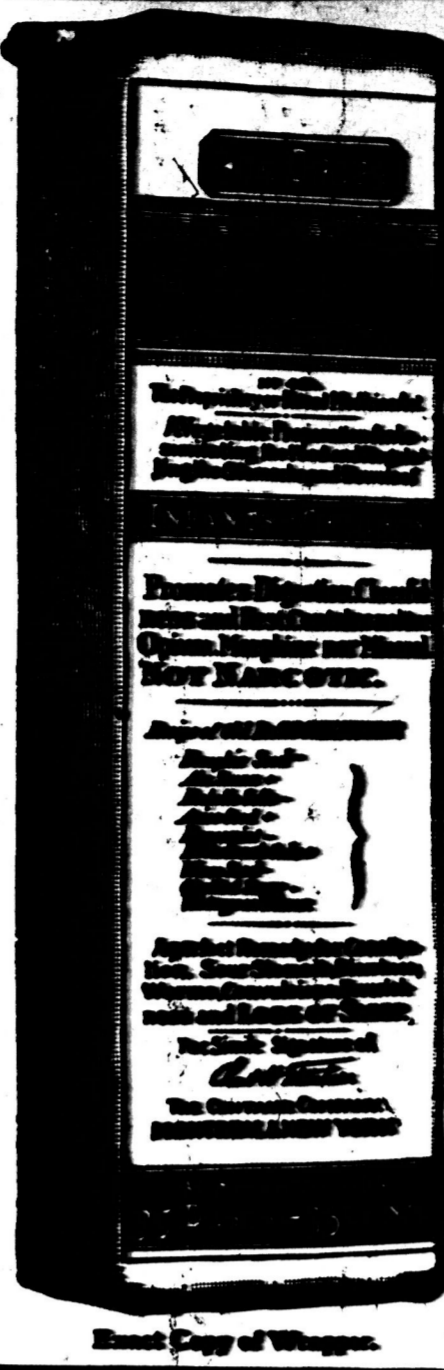
