Fires at Simcoe

Simcoe, Jan. 23.—Two fires here within the last twenty-four hours resulted in the destruction of Thomas Cook's barn with a threshing machine and other equipment, together with a quantity of hay and grain, and the ruin of A. Finch's household effects by water and smoke. His residence was saved. There was no insurance in either case.

Late Thomas Gillies

On Monday, the 18th inst., there passed away suddenly and peacefully one of our oldest and best-known residents in the person of Mr. T. L. Gillies. That morning he went out as usual to attend to some business in his lumber yard and shortly afterward was found unconscious. He was tenderly conveyed to his home and expired shortly afterwards from the effects of the stroke.

He was born in Guelph some 85 years ago. After spending his early childhood there, he came to Port Dover and subsequently went to Australia where he remained seven years and then returned to Port Dover, and where he has resided ever since, conducting a lumber business with much success. He was Reeve of Woodhouse and Port Dover for eight years and filled that important office faithfully and well. Advancing years however, caused him to cease taking any very active part in municipal affairs. In politics he was a staunch Reformer and took much interest in the welfare and prosperity of this country. In religion he was a Presbyterian and a consistent member of a member of Knox church during his residence here.

The funeral took place from his late residence on Wednesday week to the Port Dover cemetery and was very largely attended. Many floral tributes testified to the esteem in which he was held by his friends and fellow citizens, whose sympathy is tendered to his bereaved relatives, of whom he leaves a family to mourn his departure, at the ripe old age of 85 years.—Maple Leaf.

Hydro at Simcoe

The Reformer learns that the present delay in the completion of the Hydro-Electric system in Simcoe is due to a dispute as to right-of-way just north of Waterford. Poles are up and wiring is all done along the line from Simcoe to Brantford, with the exception of a short stretch crossing the fifth, sixth and seventh concessions of township, where there is a jog in what is known as the Blue Line.

When this little difficulty is settled, the line will be completed and the current turned on at once. There is also some little delay in the manufacturing of the caps for the iron standards, which have to be made of a special make to fit the latest model of Tungsten lights, but the whole work is expected to be finished by the fifteenth of February.—Reformer.

The law regarding newspapers has been amended so that it protects the publishers more than formerly. Any one taking a newspaper from the post office, whether they have ordered it or not, becomes liable for payment for same, unless it is marked "Specimen Copy." Another amendment is that no subscriber to a newspaper can stop same or refuse it at the postoffice until they have paid up all that is in arrears.
