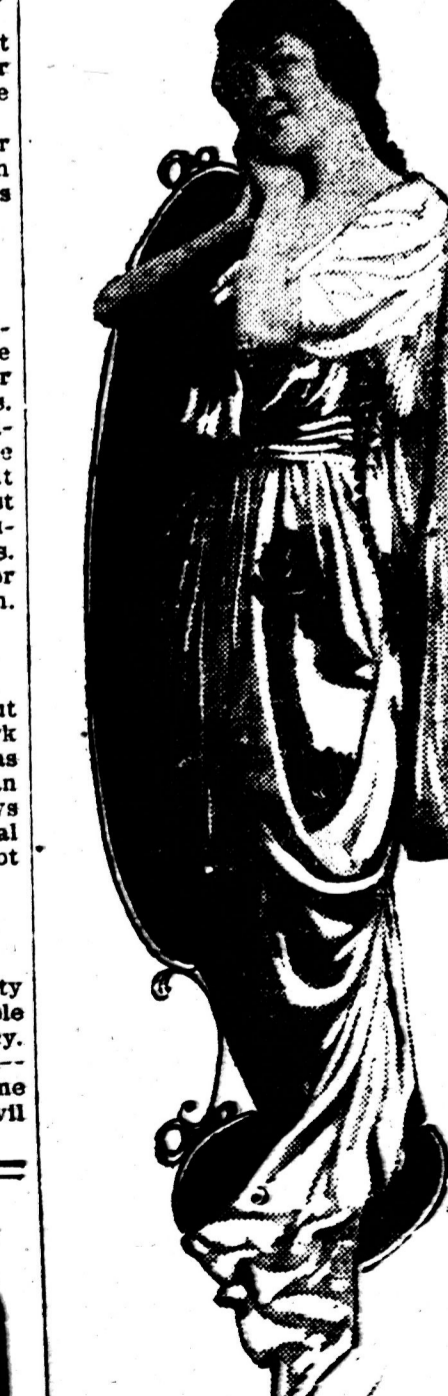
FIRE LOSSES.

The Housekeeper

To make a liquid rouge, take thirty grams of carmine, ammonia fluid, one ounce, and rose water four ounces. Mix.

To remove spots from furniture, mix equal parts of alcohol, ammonia fluid, and pure cider vinegar. Shake it well for five minutes to mix evenly and apply with a soft cloth. Wipe with another cloth and polish with woollen cloth.

Don't throw away an old umbrella, but enamel the frame white and use for an extra clothes hanger. Suspend the frame by the handle and hang small articles on it. It will rust nothing after it is enameled.

If potatoes are placed at once in boiling water with a little milk and salt added, it will prevent their turning dark.

To remove indelible ink, soak in strong salt water and rinse in ammonia water. Repeat process till all ink is removed.

When the cream is too thin to whip, add the unbeaten white of an egg. You will have no trouble in whipping the cream.

To remove ink from the fingers, dampen a sulphur match and rub the stains.

In making peach ice cream, add a few drops of almond flavoring and it will be delicious.

Great saving can be effected in the use of metal polish if it is mixed with paraffin oil. A tin of polish and about four egg cupfuls of the oil shaken together will last for months, besides being much cleaner to use.

Varnished paint can be kept bright by soaking in water a bag filled with flaxseed, and then using the bag as a cloth to wipe off the paint.

To preserve fruit jar rubbers cover with dry flour. When wanted, the flour can readily be wiped off with a dry cloth, and the rubbers will be good as new. Any rubber goods can be preserved for years in this way.

Vinegar will remove fly specks from almost anything - windows, pictures, cupboard, shelves, woodwork, etc.
