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Beekeepers' Field Day.

Next to doing a thing yourself, the best way to learn is to see it done. As you see a man do it in some convenient way, you may learn a man will show you. That is what you will have a chance to do at the Field Day of Rev. Eric Lewis, Cayuga, Ont., on Thursday, June 3rd, 1915, at 10 o'clock sharp.
A qualified apary instructor sent by the Ontario Department of Agriculture will show how to examine bees for disease, and will actually put a colony through the treatment or cure. Other manipulations will be shown, such as finding the queen, removing bees from supers, operating to prevent swarming, etc.
All local beekeepers will be asked to attend and assist in the discussion of practical questions.
These apary demonstrations are being held all over Ontario, and it will be well worth your while to attend one.
Ladies are especially invited, and all are advised to bring bee veils so they can come right out into the apary with comfort.
