The German attack in Galicia has spent its force.

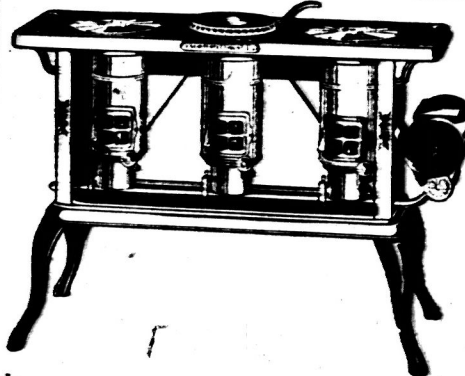
