The date for the hearing has not been given out yet, but will likely be some time this week. Shelley was brought from Woodstock jail, where he has been since receiving a sentence of two years in the Kings on penitentiary for an offence against a young girl in Norwich. In the event of Shelley being sent up for trial the case will not be heard till the fall assize, as no cases of that nature are tried at the June sessions.
