### J. PALMER DROPS DEAD.

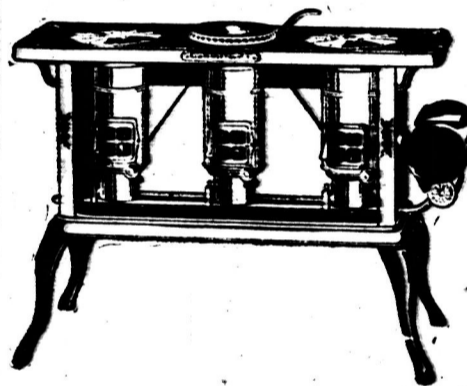
