**Germans New Admit  
Loss of U-14**

Amsterdam, June 15.—The German Admiralty today officially admitted that the submarine U-14 had been destroyed and its crew made prisoners, according to Berlin despatches to-night.

Announcement was made in the British House of Commons last week that a German submarine had been destroyed and its crew made prisoners. The name of the boat was not given.

**To Confiscate  
German Ships**

Rome, June 14.—The Italian foreign office today maintained its right to confiscate German ships, despite the fact that Italy and Germany are not formally at war, but gave assurance that Italy will pay for all German ships seized.

The foreign office replied to a protest filed by Germany, through the Swiss embassy, against the closure of the German steamer Bayern in the Bay of Naples. The Bayern's cargo was found to contain eight aeroplanes, 14 quick firers and large quantities of ammunition.

**Rumania May  
Join the Allies**

Rome, June 14.—Rumania has signed a tentative agreement with Russia renewing the obstacles preventing Rumania from entering the war on the side of the allies, according to a telegram received today by the Mon-egrin minister here. The report is not confirmed from other sources.

Press despatches from Bucharest today said that the negotiations are continuing.

**Shelley Committed**

Simcoe, June 13.—The preliminary hearing of Emerson Shelley, arraigned on a charge of murdering Mr. C. Shoup, was concluded at noon yesterday, when the magistrate committed the prisoner for trial.

Following the evidence given at the first sitting of the Magistrate's Court held on June 5, other evidence was submitted and he was duly sent up for trial.

Crown Attorney T. R. Slight in his summary of the evidence, pointed out that Shelley had been in Simcoe a few days previous to the murder. He had exhibited a revolver and said he contemplated holding up certain hog buyers, the mail driver and a certain farmer in Walsingham. Shoup had been killed by a revolver shot.

H. P. Innes, K.C., in summing up for the defence, said that there was no evidence to show anything Shelley did between the time he left John Carr's home about one o'clock, and the time he was arrested in Woodstock. He asked for dismissal on these grounds.

The prisoner declined to make any statement and the magistrate committed him for trial on the evidence produced by the Crown. The fall sessions are set for September 21, and Shelley will likely appear then on trial.

**Italians Capture Fourth  
Hydroplane**

Rome, June 15.—The Italians have captured their fourth Austrian hydroplane. The machine flew over Venice dropping bombs, but was forced to descend to the sea while returning to Pola and was picked up by a patrol boat.

**New Battery at Guelph**

Guelph, June 15.—Orders have been received from London Military headquarters to begin recruiting in town at once for the 29th Overseas Battery which is to be commanded by Major Coghlan.
