C. H. Conner, city Solicitor for St. Catharines, has passed away in his fifty-ninth year.

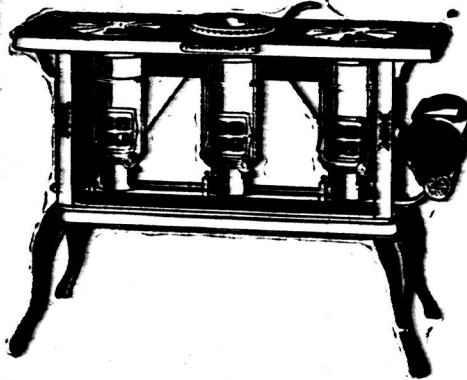

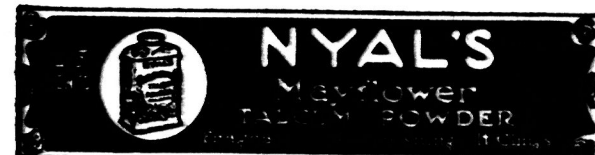
