We, your Building Committee, beg leave to report as follows:—

1. Would recommend the hall at the main entrance to the court house be redecorated.
2. That plaster in the grand jury room and hall leading to the same be repaired.
3. That the leak on the roof be repaired, and the damage caused by said leak be redecorated, and Mr. T. Walsh look after same.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

McConnell - Aldridge—That the report of the Finance Committee be adopted as read. Carried.

Roulston - Ingles—That By-laws No. 538 and 539 be repealed, and that a by-law be prepared fixing the salary of the Superintendent of County Roads at \$75.00 per month up to October 1st, 1915 and \$35.00 thereafter, and that the duties be the same as provided for by By-law No. 515. Carried.

Aldridge - Pyle—That the bill to fix the salary of the County Road Superintendent be read a second time. Carried.

Holmes - Clark—That the By-law fixing the Superintendent's salary be read a third time, signed, sealed, numbered and entitled a By-law as in the original motion. Carried.

Bain - Patton—That a By-law be introduced and read a first time for the purpose of providing for the current expenses of the County for the year 1915. Carried.

Buckner - McConnell—That the bill to provide for the general expenditure of the County be read a second time. Carried.

Holmes - Ingles—That a By-law to provide for the liabilities and general expenditures of the County of Haldimand for the year 1915, and that the By-law be read a third time, signed, sealed, numbered and entitled a By-law as in the original motion. Carried.

Bain - Patton—That a further sum of \$9,000 be taken up on the credit obtained by the County from the Canadian Bank of Commerce in Cayuga and that the Warden and Treasurer sign a note for the same. Carried.

Roulston - Aldridge—That Mr. Bain, the Chairman of the County Roads Committee, is hereby instructed to be present and witness the transfer of the books and other property belonging to the County from R. G. Kyd to D. W. McBurney. Carried.

Ingles - Holmes—That the Clerk repair a By-law fixing the salary of the County Engineer at \$8 per day and mileage of 10c per mile one way as and when his services are required, and upon written instructions from the County Road Superintendent, and that the By-law be read a first time. Carried.

Pyle - Roulston—That the By-law fixing the salary of the County Engineer be read a second time. Carried.

Aldridge - McConnell—That the By-law fixing the salary of the County Engineer be read a third time, signed, sealed and entitled a By-law as in the original motion. Carried.

McConnell - Patton—That T. E. Cline be paid the sum of \$605 for automobile purchased for District Agricultural Representatives at Cayuga, \$300 to be charged against the agricultural grant made by the County for 1915, and \$305 to be charged against the grant made for 1916, the Department having agreed to pay interest on \$305. Carried.

Buckner - Patton—That the report of the County Road Committee be received and read. Carried.
