### THE NEWSPAPER LAW.

The law regarding newspapers has been amended so that it protects the publishers more than formerly. Any one taking a newspaper from the post office, whether they have ordered it er not, becomes liable for payment for mme, unless it is marked "Specimen Copy." Another amendment is that no subscriber to a newspaper can stop same or refuse it at the postoffice untill they have paid up all that is
